#### Lunches

As you know, Morgan staff have tried something new this year with playing first and eating second, knowing that many schools have found benefit in doing so. Although there have been some enjoyed pieces in this new routine, teachers have found smoother transitions with eat first, play second. Starting in January, Morgan will switch back to this previous practice. Eating will be 11:35-11:50. Outside time will be from 11:50-12:30. If you find your child is not eating as much as expected after our January switch, we encourage you to reach out to your child's teacher.

#### **Communicating Student Learning**

On Friday, December 15th, our first formal Learning Update goes home.

Teachers have the choice of whether to provide official Learning Updates in the form of a digital portfolio, or in a written template.

If your child's teacher has chosen the written template, on December 15<sup>th</sup>, you can expect to receive an update telling you how your child is approaching the learning, and how they are doing in relation to the learning standards.

Digital portfolios provide learning updates that are intended to be ongoing throughout the year. If your child's teacher is using the Spaces digital portfolio, they will send you a letter on December 15th asking you to look at learning artifacts on Spaces and to provide feedback.

### **Crossing Guards**

If you or a family member is interested in volunteering your time to help be a Crossing Guard, you can donate your time in a flexible manner. ## Surrey Schools Survey- Emailed to Families Nov. 20 Deadline to participate is November 30<sup>th</sup> at 11:59 pm.

Over the past decade, Surrey Schools has seen consistent annual growth of approximately 800 new students per year, a significant trend in itself. However, the past two years have presented unprecedented challenges, with more than 2,400 new students joining our district annually – a remarkable 200% increase. This surge has surpassed the available provincial funding for new schools and additions.

On November 20th, the district launched a community consultation survey to gather input from staff, students and their families on possible strategies to manage the rapid enrolment growth while maintaining the quality of our students' educational experience. Proposed changes include tri-semester schooling, school "shifts," busing students out-ofcatchment, and hybrid online learning models. While some of these strategies may be new to the district, they also present an opportunity to integrate innovative learning approaches that may better prepare our students for their future careers and align with the evolving workplace landscape. The survey closes at 11:59 p.m. on November 29th. The survey will be available in English, Arabic, Chinese, Punjabi, Spanish and Tagalog.
