## REPORTS

### 4.1 Principal's Report - Mr. Bobby Samra

- Mr. Samra will be leaving Ocean Cliff in September 2018. This was an unexpected decision only recently advised by the District. Mr. Samra would like to thank PAC and parents for working with him during his time at Ocean Cliff.
- Additional copies of the Core Competencies \& Resources handout have been given to PAC for anyone who is interested. The handout was discussed at the March $2^{\text {nd }}$ PAC Meeting as part of Social Emotional Learning and a digital copy was published with the Meeting Minutes.
- Saleema Noon: Saleema Noon Sexual Health Educators presented sexual health and body science workshops to students May 2 \& 3. A small number of families notified the school in advance of the program that they had chosen not to have their children participate which was supported by the school. A larger number of families notified the school the morning of the presentations that they would not like to have their children participate. It is believed that some parents mistakenly thought the presentations were SOGI (Sexual Orientation \& Gender Identity) related. It is important for parents to understand that SOGI is not a curriculum that is taught in school. SOGI is a mindset that has been adopted by the District in order to promote and create an inclusive and safe learning environment for all students.
o NOTE FOR FUTURE PRESENTATIONS: The parent information meeting should be held at least one week prior to the in-class presentations. This will provide sufficient opportunity for any parents who have questions regarding the content of the presentations to contact the appropriate school staff for clarification.
- Assemblies:
o BC Lions Fortis BC Energy Champions Program: a fun, high energy, interactive presentation that taught the importance of environmental responsibility and becoming an "Energy Champion"
o Flyin Bob: a one man circus presentation that used juggling, clowning, unicycling, acrobatics, wire walking, audience participation, and comedy to stress the
importance of physical activity, concentration, peer support, community, and the value of failure as well as success.
o Parent concern: One part of Flyin Bob's show involved a joke in which he flipped upside down and his pants fell off to show costume Hello Kitty boxers. This may not be an appropriate joke for children in a school setting. Response: the school was not aware that this was part of the act prior to the show and recognized the parent's concerns.
- Ultimate Frisbee: The season is now complete and there are plans for the school to join a competitive league next year.
- Track \& Field: Track and Field has started with students participating in mini-track meets. Ocean Cliff is the 2 time defending champion at the District Meet and hopes to be competitive again this year.
- Staffing: Ocean Cliff will be hiring 2 teachers next year to fill the term positions that will completed at the end of this school year.
- Aboriginal Week: There has been a shift in focus from teaching Aboriginal studies as a separate learning module to incorporating Aboriginal education into lesson plans and learning activities throughout the year. Welcome and Closing Assemblies will mark the week. Ocean Cliff will also be hosting a soccer camp on Wednesday for Aboriginal students. Our school shares an Aboriginal Support Worker with several other schools; students from those schools will be coming together to participate in the camp.
