- Staffing changes increased Learner Support allocation by 1 day/week; Mme Lavoie retiring end of Jan.; K/1 teacher Ms. Hua 8-wk compassionate care leave; Change of band teacher due to previous teacher taking leave.

Treasurer's Report ~ Updated financial reports circulated ~ Laura C.

- final tally from the Annual PAC Fundraising Campaign is \$11,647 from 87 families and one business.
- \$1,000 from Dayhu Group of Companies came in during last week of December; many thanks to the Sandhu family.
- PAC contributed \$5600 to new furniture for library & learning commons furniture is now in
- Snowball Dance raised \$2800!; Hot Lunch Round 1: \$6300
- Spent ½ operating budget so far; Gaming ¼ spent, \$8000 left in gaming account
- Looking on track to put \$45,000 to playground fund, wait until next month to make motion about this as there may be more info on gov't announcement of playground funding with February's provincial budget.
