- PAC is in a healthy financial position at present; bank statements are available for review at any time.
- Financial summary of the year, including fundraising income, playground savings, & budget discussion for next year.

  - Annual Fundraising Campaign (previously "Cheque-Writing Campaign"), Sept-Dec 2017 = \$11,697
  - Spring Fling, April 2018 = \$9733
  - Snowball Dance, Dec 2017 = \$2790

## Playground Committee ~ Sean H.

- The Provincial Government announced 2 weeks ago a fund of \$5 million/year to build and replace school playgrounds based on greatest need around the province; Peace Arch is not on the list of Surrey District schools that are even in the running to be nominated for funding, and as such we are going to forge ahead with fundraising the full amount of approximately \$150,000. (\$50k has been saved so far; see below)
- Fundraising ideas: scratch-books, pub night, corporate donations, pizza party for division that raises the most money?
- Build an image of the playground in a highly visible place around the school yard, so parents see fundraising progress; stickers saying "I played on the playground today!" for parents to see how often their child uses the playground
- Habitat provides templates for letters and fundraising ideas
- "3-2-1 Rock" run-a-thon collecting pledges (perhaps associated with MEC, The Running Room, or other local businesses); could we approach the City of White to donate track space or advertising; could coincide with Cross Country or Track; Reid C. is excited to donate hats!!
- Sean circulated an updated letter for fundraising requests from local groups and businesses.

Motion to set aside \$25,000 from this year's fundraising efforts for Playground Savings. Moved by Laura C., seconded by Elizabeth M. All in favour, none opposed. Motion passed.

this brings our total of Playground Savings to \$50,000 over the past two school years.
