A large portion of our playground is scheduled for mandatory removal by the school district summer 2019, and a second portion summer 2020; our PAC needs to fundraise approx. \$125,000 for the 2 replacement playgrounds! \$50k so far; \$75k still needed.

## Hot Lunch Program Update - Elizabeth M.

- Our Hot Lunch Program is an integral fundraiser for our school; made \$18,873 last year!
- Changes to the program this year:
  - **Payment accepted online only**, through PayPal (don't need a PayPal account; can pay as a 'guest').
  - student hot lunch monitors will hand out hot lunch this year, with 2 parents per pod supervising; but WE STILL NEED 8 PARENT VOLUNTEERS EACH WEEK TO HELP WITH HOT LUNCH DISTRIBUTION.

  - Also need 2-3 parent volunteers each week to be Hot Lunch Leaders; approx. 2-hour time commitment, receiving delivery of food from vendor, filling bins for each division, trouble-shooting any problems that arise; binder with instructions, & ample training provided! 10:45am-12:45pm. Sign up for one/many weeks this fall!
  - $\circ$   $\;$  Kindergarteners can now order in Rounds 2 & 3, starting in January.
  - White Spot Breakfast and Freshii added this year.

## Playground Committee - Sean H.

- The Surrey School District maintains and looks after the safety of a playground; they don't replace it; playground equipment is purchased by PAC.
- 2 sections of the playground are scheduled for removal: the southern-most yellow/pink/wood portion in the summer of 2019, and the northern-most green/blue one in the summer of 2020.
- We have selected 'Habitat' to design our new playground.
- no 'new' swings allowed in Surrey school district; allowed to keep existing swings.
- parents will likely be invited to help with certain aspects of installation.
- playground must be kept within same footprint that already exists.

- Playground Replacement savings so far: \$50,000 saved over the past 2 years; Goal of \$125,000, which would cover both new sections in 2019 and 2020.
- This year we need to build more awareness in the broader community around our school, seek grants from businesses and community groups.
- We have permission to install a plaque recognizing donors.
- Need to find out when Habitat needs a deposit.
- Need committee members to continue fundraising, collaborate on design, etc.
  - Sean needs more help with the project! Several more parent volunteers are needed.

#### Treasurer's Report - Jennifer W.

- PAC is in a healthy financial position at present; bank statements are available for review at any time.
- See attached appendix for Year-End Treasury Report as at June 30, 2018.
- Our PAC runs only 4 fundraisers, in place of running many smaller ones throughout the year (such as selling chocolate almonds, poinsettias, gift wrap, cookie dough, etc.)
  - 1. Hot Lunch Program (Oct-June) (last year \$18,873)
  - 2. Annual Fundraising Campaign (Sept-Dec) (last year \$11,697)
  - 3. Snowball Dance event (save the date: Dec. 7<sup>th</sup>, 2018) (last year \$2,790)
  - 4. Spring Fling Carnival event (save the date: April 26<sup>th</sup>, 2019) (last year \$9,627)
- Last year we set aside \$25,000 for playground savings (total savings now of \$50,000)
- Looking ahead to this year's budget (2018-2019):
  - o possibly re-naming pods to animal names in Semiahmoo language; might have murals or signs made with new names
  - technology: 15 more iPads to complete a set, plus an iPad cart.
  - Gaming funds must be spent on extra-curricular items only; nothing that is to be used in class for curriculum; can go towards playground, jerseys, sending kids to sporting events on a bus; must benefit the whole school.
  - Emergency Preparedness supplies: we keep food rations and emergency supplies in a locker in the parking lot with 3 days' worth for every child and staff member at the school; we replenish these supplies on a rotating 3-yr schedule.
- Explanation of Annual Fundraising Campaign (previously 'Cheque-Writing Campaign'): instead of selling a bunch of stuff we don't need or want, we just ask parents for a simple donation!
  - Runs Sept-Dec, online donations through the Surrey School District website over \$25 earn a tax receipt: (<u>https://surreyschools.schoolcashonline.com/Fee/Details/829/90/false/true</u>)
  - o re-name "Donation Drive"?
  - $\circ$   $\;$  this year we'll still accept cash, cheques, and online donations
  - Annual Fundraising Campaign History:
    - 2017/18 Campaign: \$11,697 from 87 families (approx. 25% participation)
    - 2016/17 Campaign: \$10,726 from 74 families (approx. 20% participation)
    - 2015/16 Campaign: \$11,575 from 93 families (approx. 30% participation)
  - With approximately 350 families at Peace Arch, our goal this year is to significantly increase participation in our annual fundraising effort. PAC funds benefit ALL STUDENTS at Peace Arch from Kindergarten to Grade 7, and we encourage ALL FAMILIES to make a contribution, no matter how big or small. In the past three years, we've had donations ranging from \$500 to \$5.00; every little bit helps, and every amount is valued.
