Welcome and introductions by Erin H.

Admin Report ~ Carol D.

Secretary

- great start-up: 548 kids, exactly what was projected by district
- increase to 25 divisions; 9 English and 16 French Immersion
- portable arriving in the next couple of weeks
- 1st day assembly: introductions to admin, fun and silly intro; more assemblies in Oct to cultivate school culture
- Fri Sept 22 Terry Fox & Cops for Cancer tour stops by
- Cross-country (Gr. 3-6), Soccer (Gr. 6-7), Choir, leadership (announcements and lunch monitors) have all started up
- Fit Kids training for Gr 6-7 to be fitness leaders; throughout the year kids will set up stations in the gym for younger kids
- Back to School/Meet the Teacher BBQ Thursday Sept 28th 5-7pm
- Orange Shirt Day on Friday Sept. 29th; age-appropriate teaching re. First Nations reconciliation efforts; motto "every child matters"
- Individual student photos Mon Oct 2nd
- early dismissals for "get-to-know-you" conferences; 1:25pm dismissal for Kindergarten Gr. 7
- "We Day" Wed. Oct. 18 at Rogers Arena
- staff are hoping to have a representative attend each PAC meeting (different staff member each time); thank you to Mme. Ahonen for attending tonight's meeting!

Treasurer's Report ~ per Laura C.

- as this is the first PAC meeting of the year, we need to vote on a budget
- each month Laura will update the budget for PAC to re-evaluate and adjust as needed
- every year we apply for and are awarded the "Gaming Grant" of approx.. \$11,000, usually comes in early Oct; must be spent each year, with constraints (eg. must be extracurricular)
- proposal to set aside another \$15k for playground
- last year we made \$48k in fundraising
- last year the school asked for \$10k for the Learning Commons, but with the adjustment of classroom placement, the space intended for the LC is now a classroom, so instead of the \$10k, PAC provided \$3,763 for new library furniture
- Emergency Preparedness Arin B.: we're in a 3-year cycle where we must replace food rations every 3yrs. Our current supply is for 575 PEOPLE; with 548 students + 55 staff, we need to increase amount; Arin requests more than \$2,000 for this year's stock, will advise with an estimate; need more first aid kits for the increase in divisions; tents, tarps, portable toilets, flashlights, emergency blankets, megaphone, portable radios, etc.

- considering 2 parent presentations this year: Saleema Noon sexual health presentation, and internet safety
- this year we are trying to balance the need for the huge playground expense, with still providing a great school experience for our kids like we do every year
- **Gardening Committee Maria R.**: we have money in our budget to maintain some of the garden spaces around the school; looking for volunteers to help with weeding and maintaining pots and gardens around school. Please email Maria if you can help! mc_dimou@yahoo.ca.

Playground Committee ~ Sean H.

- The Surrey School District maintains and looks after the safety of a playground; they don't replace it
- Peace Arch Elem. has been given a 2-year warning that south-most red/yellow playground will need replacing
- this summer Sean met with "Habitat" playground company, and provided examples of new playgrounds around Surrey, and approx. new playground costs
- no 'new' swings allowed in Surrey school district; allowed to keep existing swings
- the north-most (farthest away) playground (intermediate playground) is scheduled for removal a couple years after the yellow/red one (south-most)
- parents will likely be invited to help with certain aspects of installation
- playground must be kept within same footprint that already exists
- Sean needs help with the project! Many thanks to Chantal S. for volunteering! A few more parent volunteers are still needed to join the Playground Committee. Please email peacearchPACnews@gmail.com.

2017-2018 Cheque-Writing Campaign (Newly branded as "Annual PAC Fundraising Campaign") ~ Erin H.

- last year our goal was \$50k, and we made \$11k from approx. 20% of families at the school (74 families out of 350)
- this year our goal is \$20k, plus increased participation from more families
- CWC; Hot Lunch; Spring Fling = our only 3 fundraisers
- Carol will inquire if we can add the CWC to the school's online payment system (donations would attract a tax receipt)
- discussion about changing wording from CWC to Fundraising campaign or other; "annual fundraising"; "project Peace Arch"; "Project Peace Arch Annual Fundraising Drive"; etc. Ideas?

Other Business ~ Erin H.

- MOTION: to accept the Proposed PAC Budget for 2017/18. Moved by Laura C. Seconded by Julie R. and Sean H. All in favour, none opposed, motion passed.
- We still need parent volunteers to fill a few roles on the PAC:
 - CPF co-volunteer (attend Canadian Parents for French meetings every couple of months, and report to PAC)
 - DPAC volunteer (attend monthly District PAC Meetings in Surrey, and report to PAC)
 - Spring Fling Coordinator (lead the army of Spring Fling volunteers; most roles already filled, just need a boss!)
- Lively discussion about drop-off zones on Roper Ave:
 - o continues to be a problem, people parking and leaving their vehicles unattended in the drop-off zones
 - o discussion about how to educate parents about the parking rules
 - Const. Sears is inquiring about lit School Zone signs from City Engineering; discussion about Buena Vista and Thrift crosswalks; Carol D. to request 'No Idling' signs from Healthy Schools BC
- To clarify, there are TWO Drop Off Zones on the north side of Roper (westbound traffic only):
 - from the driveway/gate of the lower grass field, west until the main crosswalk on Roper
 - from the main crosswalk on Roper, west until the staff parking lot driveway
