*SPECIAL NOTE regarding COVID-19 Pandemic. PAC Update from March-Sept 2020:

- Our last PAC Meeting was held online, on May 19, 2020, while in-school instruction was suspended.
- Hot Lunch program was suspended; 10th Annual Spring Fling fundraiser set for April 24th was cancelled.
- Planning for Phase 2 of the Playground Replacement Project stalled during the spring, then resumed over the summer.
- The AGM and Elections for the PAC Executive, usually held annually in May, were postponed until Sept. 2020.
- We hosted a modified Staff Appreciation Lunch for Peace Arch teachers and staff on June 19th; packaged lunches from *Laura's Coffee*; families decorated the school sidewalks with chalk art expressing our thanks to the whole staff!
- We weren't able to host our usual Welcome Back Coffee table for parents on the first day of school this Sept.
- PAC Welcome letters were sent to Kindergarten families during the second week of school.

1. Welcome – Jennifer W.

- Welcome to the first Peace Arch PAC meeting of the year! Attendees logged in using their student's account or as guests on *Microsoft Teams*. Thank you to new Principal Laureen Boulet & Acting Vice-Principal Amy Grainger for joining the meeting.

2. Principal's Report – Laureen B.


2.1 Upcoming Events

- Terry Fox Run Sept. 24-25: teachers signed up for 30 min. blocks to run/walk on the grass field in their cohorts; teaching about Terry in classrooms all week; consider an <u>online donation</u>: a "toonie for Terry" and cancer research.
- Orange Shirt Day Wed., Sept 30: "<u>Every Child Matters</u>" campaign; will be discussed in classrooms, what's special about us all; older grades discuss Reconciliation as appropriate; invited to wear orange on Sept. 30th.

2.2 School Updates

- Peace Arch has several new staff; increase in EA/ABA staffing; Virtual Meet-The-Teacher event at the end of the month
- Blended Learning: 55 students at Peace Arch chose this program; time at the school will gradually increase as comfort grows; 5 families are home-schooling; 480 students returned face-to-face; *parents with specific questions about the Blended Learning program, please call the school office at 604-536-8711.*
 - \circ $\;$ The K-7 English Blended students are housed at South Meridian
 - French Immersion Blended are housed at Peace Arch or Laronde; we also have students from Simon Cunningham, Woodward Hill, and Riverdale at both Laronde and our school ;our school has a Gr. 2/3 and Gr. 3/4 Blended Fr.Im. (teacher still needed for this one; TTOC/Amy connecting with those families currently)
- In-school learning going well so far; concern from the staff about playground time; staggered lunch times not possible, so the playground has been divided into zones to spread our students out more evenly across the grounds (pictured next page); new sports/game equipment has been purchased by the school; each day of the week is a different zone; K, Gr.1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 7; monitored by adult lunchtime supervisors and admin.

3. Treasury Report – Tana J.

- 3.1. Review of present state of PAC Balance Sheet; see attached appendix for 2019/20 Year-End Treasury Reports
 - PAC is in a healthy financial position at present; bank statements are available for review at any time.
 - Total equity: \$91,477 (~\$23,000 of this will be going towards the Playground project)
 - Liabilities: HL payments from Round 3 = \$13,085; closer to \$7,000 now after Aug/Sept refunds
 - We started 2019 (Sept) with \$71,305; we earned \$20,172 Sept 2019-March 2020
 - Review of last year's expenses
 - Playground: total price tag is \$93,755 Rotary will contribute \$63,000 of that, and GST will be rebated to PAC
 - Ideas for spending this year? Would like parent input for where to spend PAC funds for this school year
 - The last several years we've run only 4 main fundraisers, in place of many smaller ones throughout the year (such as selling chocolate almonds, poinsettias, gift wrap, cookie dough, etc.); will need to rethink this year!
 - 1. **Hot Lunch** Program (Oct-June) (2018/19 = \$18k)
- 3. **Snowball Dance** event (2019 = \$3800)
- 2. Annual Fundraising Campaign (Sept-Dec) (2018/19 = \$13k) 4. Spring Fling Carnival event (2019 = \$10k)
- Annual Fundraising Campaign / Donations Drive (previously 'Cheque-Writing Campaign'): instead of selling items we don't need or want, we just ask parents for a simple donation!
 - Runs Sept-Dec, online donations through the Surrey School District 'Cash-Online' site; \$25+ earns a tax receipt
 - 2019/20 Campaign: \$8,929 from ~70 families (approx. 19% participation)
 - 2018/19 Campaign: \$13,630 from 108 families (approx. 33% participation)
 - 2017/18 Campaign: \$11,697 from 87 families (approx. 25% participation)
 - 2016/17 Campaign: \$10,726 from 74 families (approx. 22% participation)
 - 2015/16 Campaign: \$11,575 from 93 families (approx. 30% participation)
 - Will need to decide about continuing the Donations Drive; continuity, families are now used to this style of fundraising rather than selling coupon books and poinsettias.
- 3.2. Teachers and staff to discuss their needs this year, and advise the new PAC Exec of how we can help financially.

4. Hot Lunch Program Update – Jennifer W. per Elizabeth M.

- 4.1. Our Hot Lunch Program is an integral fundraiser for our school; it made \$18,203 in 2018/19, and \$10,306 in the shortened 2019/20 year (only did 2 Rounds instead of 3).
 - Due to Round 3 being cancelled (April-June 2020), payment was refunded for 139 families, totaling \$12,053; waiting to hear how much Bambora fees will be (our credit card processing company)
 - Approx. 150 families opted to keep a credit on their account, rather than getting refunded; *reminder to register on the <u>Hot Lunch website</u> with SAME username to receive credits*; \$9,217 of credits still in our account
 - Official word from the School District: no hot lunch in Surrey schools until further notice

5.1. Recap of our Playground Replacement 'journey':

- Sept. 2016 the School District gave notice that the south playground would be due for mandatory removal in approx. 3 years. The District gives a few years' advance notice so their PAC can begin fundraising for a replacement.
- Feb. 2017 the District advised that the yellow/pink playground (Phase 1) was indeed on the District's list for removal in 2019, and the north blue/green playground (Phase 2), including log roll & tire swing, would likely be intended for removal 2021/22. We knew playground fundraising would be a huge task, and didn't want our parent community to suffer from "fundraising fatigue" by running two large campaigns only a couple years apart. So PAC undertook a fundraising campaign for BOTH replacement projects.
- July 2019 after 2½ years of fundraising \$100,000 from our generous Peace Arch families and broader community, our wheel-chair accessible Phase 1 playground was installed by parent volunteers and Habitat Systems.
- June 2019 the <u>Rotary Club of White Rock</u> approached our PAC to discuss helping fundraise for Phase 2; they are also working with the White Rock Elem. PAC to fundraise for their new playground; Rotary hosted the Turkey Run in Oct. 2019, Book Sale in Dec. 2019, and acquired significant private donations and cost-savings through their wonderful community connections. *Thank you Rotary*!!!
- Sept. 2020 Rotary presented our PAC with a cheque for \$63,000, and PAC fundraising and tax rebates will cover the remaining \$31,000 for Phase 2's installation later this fall (total Phase 2 cost = \$94,000). We'll be seeking parent volunteers to install the playground over a weekend. Can you help? Seeking a project manager and 15 parent volunteers for a Sat-Sun install.
