Playground Replacement Update





Our main playground structure is slated for *mandatory removal* in 2019, and the northern green playground in 2020.

Funding for a replacement playground comes from PAC. That means YOU, the parents! All playground structures at Peace Arch Elementary are maintained by the Surrey School District and are subject to annual reviews for safety and maintenance affordability. **Our main yellow and pink playground structure (south end, closest to Roper Ave.) has been identified by the School Board for** *mandatory removal* in 2019, with the green play structure at the north end of the play area coming out the following year. PAC is responsible for raising funds from parents, non-profit grants, and the business community to fund replacement structures. If funds are not sufficient to replace this playground the site will be turned into an empty space for general use.

Last week the Provincial Government announced its Playground Equipment Program will provide \$5 million per year to build/replace school playgrounds (<u>https://news.gov.bc.ca/releases/2018PREM0023-000863</u>). The program is based on greatest need, and only one school in the Surrey School District was awarded funding this year. With this in mind, our Peace Arch PAC does not expect to receive a portion of this provincial funding, and intends to proceed with efforts to fundraise for the entire cost of the playground.

A replacement playground will cost upwards of \$150,000, and we have only one more year to continue fundraising for this huge project. This year we will earmark \$20-25k towards our Playground Fund, bringing our total thus far to \$50k. Our Annual Fundraising Campaign at the beginning of next school year will focus on communicating this pressing need to our school community. 2018/19 AGM & Elected Executive Roles

We are looking forward to voting in our new PAC Executive committee at our **May 16th AGM**. Executive positions and some of their duties are:

A. The President/Chair may

- speak on behalf of the council
- consult with council members
- preside at membership and executive meetings
- ensure that an agenda is prepared
- ensure that the council is represented in school and district activities
- work closely with the school's administration team to achieve objectives

B. The Vice-President may

- support the president
- assume the duties of the president in the president's absence or upon request
- assist the president in the performance of his or her duties
- accept extra duties as required

C. The Secretary may

- ensure that members are notified of meetings
- record and file minutes of all meetings
- prepare and maintain other documentation as requested by the membership or executive
- create PAC newsletters

D. The Treasurer may

- be a signing officer
- ensure all funds are properly accounted for
- disburse funds as authorized by the membership or executive
- ensure that proper financial records and books of account are maintained
- with the assistance of the executive, draft an annual budget
- ensure that another signing officer has access to the financial records in the treasurer's absence
- submit an annual financial statement at the annual general meeting
