- Welcome to first Parent Advisory Council (PAC) meeting of 2016/2017 school year by Erin H.
 - PAC meetings will alternate this year: Tuesday/Wednesday evenings, 6:30pm in school library.
 - Meetings: Wed. Oct 19th, Tues. Nov 15th, Wed. Jan 18th, Tues. Feb 21st, Wed. Apr 19th, Tues. May 16th.
 - ALL parents and guardians of Peace Arch students are welcome, and are voting members of the PAC.
- PAC Website: peacearch.hotlunches.net. This is not just for hot lunch! If you have a child at Peace Arch, please register for this website to stay up to date with our school community.

Admin Report ~ Deb T.

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- Warm welcome to Peace Arch's new Vice-Principal, Fiona Eckert; off to a great start.
- The school has enthusiastically launched right into the musical production of *Oliver!*, directed by Al Pitchler.
 - Grades 1-7 participating; two entire casts; there will be a "prequel" scene with a French component.
 - \circ Wed., Sept. 28th, 3:00pm: meeting for parents who are interested in helping with production
 - "Shaw On Demand" currently has Oliver! (the musical) and Oliver Twist showing for free.
- The school mural should start this week, & be completed in time for *Oliver!* On wall to the left of the gym doors.
- Cross-country and soccer are underway. Go Ravens!
- Wed. Sept. 28th: Cops for Cancer will be visiting the school. Terry Fox donations are divided between 'Cops for Cancer' and the Terry Fox Foundation. Terry Fox Run is Friday, Sept. 30th.
- In June the school will celebrate Canada's 150th anniversary along with celebrations for Aboriginal Day.
- Great enthusiasm from the staff for the school's Learning Commons construction, planned for this year.
 - What is a Learning Commons? From <u>http://aslc.ca/blog/what-is-a-learning-commons-anyway</u>:
 - "A learning "space" that is both physical & virtual a place to experiment, practice, celebrate, learn, work & play..." How is it different from the traditional school library? "Traditional school libraries are seen as quiet places full of printed books, people reading and librarians 'shushing'. A Learning Commons takes school libraries into the 21st century. Yes, we still have printed text, and there are still people reading, and there is still a librarian... There is a hum of activity with students talking, learning, searching for information on a variety of devices, focusing on content creation and synthesizing of information. The Learning Commons becomes the hub and the heart of the school; a place to collaborate to build inquiry learning and critical thinking skills in students; a place for technology integration and experimentation; a place that is 'owned' by students and staff alike."
- Administration's doors are open; happy to work with parents and our school community.

Vice-Principal ~ Fiona E.

- Has had a nice warm welcome from the staff and parent community; she taught at Peace Arch about 10 yrs ago.
- Traffic safety is an area of concern at our school.
 - Seeking parents able to assist with supervision of crosswalk; Deb will pursue getting a crossing guard.

Treasurer's Report ~ Laura C.

- Last school year (2015/16) PAC raised just over \$47,000. The BC Gaming Grant generates approx. \$10k/year, and can be spent only on extra-curricular expenses.
- Chess club starting up again after *Oliver!*; Ms. Walsh to be the teacher sponsor, and Laura C. the parent sponsor.
- A teacher has requested funds for a 5-week yoga program (once/week) for the entire school.
 - Discussion about the \$6,000 cost of the program; perhaps only for intermediate? Staff to discuss.
- Detailed report on last year's actuals, along with projected expenditures for this year.
- New sports jerseys needed for Grade 6 & 7 teams. Laura C. to investigate further.

- Projected Operating budget = \$21,125. Projected Gaming budget = \$15,500. Projected Capital Expenditures budget =
 - i) \$10k for Learning Commons
 - ii) \$3k for yoga (with possible future discussion to fund an additional \$3k if requested would require approval by PAC vote)
 - iii) a \$30k set-aside this year for savings towards a new school playground (savings required over 3-4 years). Discussion that this set-aside would only occur provided the Cheque Writing Campaign raises sufficient funds to cover the rest of the approved budget items.
- **New playground structure:** the yellow metal/wooden playground structure is on its last legs; need to investigate cost of replacement, & possibility of grants from City of White Rock and private community groups like Rotary.
 - Seeking parents interested in taking on this project, preferably Kindergarten or Gr. 1 parent.
 - Will do better job of advertising our next PAC meeting to Kindergarten parents, and have further discussion on creating a committee for the Playground.
 - Discussion about how to highlight items other than the playground in our Cheque-Writing Campaign for fundraising; it's a long-term goal, and will take 3-4 years to fully fund.
 - Important to point out to parents how our fundraising is helping ALL groups of students at the school: primary, intermediate, English, French, sports, arts, etc.
- Emergency Preparedness: some new equipment will be needed this year, and next year we'll need to increase the budget to begin replacement of emergency food rations.
- Noral E. would like to ask a staff member at the school to organize students to water and care for the planters in the courtyard outside the office. Leadership club?
- MOTION: to accept the Proposed PAC Budget for 2016/17. Moved by Laura C. Seconded by Fiona K. All in favour, no one opposed. Motion passed.
- Discussion about Cheque-Writing Campaign. Laura C. and Shelley D. to investigate adding new website re. CWC fundraising; or perhaps adding option on Hot Lunch order to make a donation (no tax receipt would be available if donating directly to PAC though).

Other Business ~ Erin H.

- Rowland W. **District PAC (DPAC) Report**: last year we pushed for more capital funding for Surrey School District with letter-writing & phone campaign. Our PAC supports keeping this momentum going, especially for the new high school in South Surrey.
- Julie R. proposes purchasing school-owned **Band books** for next school year; music books that belong to the school and are signed out by band students each year. Approx cost is \$15 each; suggestion for parents to donate their child's old band books back to the school.
- **Grade 7 Fundraising**: done by Grade 7 students and parents; the Grade 7 Farewell Ceremony is paid for by PAC; Gr.7's do movie nights, popcorn, candygrams, doughnuts, freezies, etc. to raise money for camp and year-end outings; request from PAC for the Grade 7 fundraising coordinators to please stay in touch with PAC.
- Tamsin L. **CPF** (Canadian Parents for French): Cougar Creek French Immersion is newly opened, and its library is in need of **primary French books**. There will be a yellow box available in our library for donations.
- Admin will look into the possibility of our PAC starting a Facebook group to keep our parent community engaged and informed. Maria R. volunteers to administer the group if given green light.
