1. Introductions - Laura C.

- Welcome and introductions; thank you all for attending! 2. Admin Report - Carol D. \& Chris B.

### 2.1. Recent Events:

- Pod renaming - getting used to the new names!; everyone at school is making a great effort to use the new names instead of the old pod numbers; Pod Renaming Celebration assembly went very well and was featured in the Peace Arch News and through the Surrey School District.
- Received a "Special Projects" grant from District level Aboriginal Education to commission artwork and workshops to complete the renaming.
- Ski and Snowboard Club - last day is Feb 28th; many thanks for parents' understanding re. large buses in the drop-off zone on Ski Club days.
- Sand the Clown workshops - two snow days will be made up in May; instruction in English and French.
- Science Fair was held today (Feb 26); 98 students from 4 classes participated, plus 8 judges; 4 students will attend the District Science Fair at Central City on March $7^{\text {th. }}$
- Wrapping up Basketball this week.
- Pink Shirt Day for kindness and anti-bullying, Wed., Feb $27^{\text {th }}$ - class activities as well as assembly.
- Field trips: Skating, Art Gallery, Fort Langley.
- Practicum students working with Mme Grainger and Mrs. Calbick.


### 2.2. Upcoming events:

- Choir Festival at the Bell Centre, Tuesday, March $5^{\text {th }}$.
- Speech Fest/Concours - March 13 (concours).
- RCMP presentations - Bullying Awareness and ODD Squad from the VPD.
- Term 2 progress reporting prior to Spring Break; no specific day for report cards to come home; parents should be up-to-date on their child's learning based on continual feedback throughout the school year, via FreshGrade or other reporting methods; report cards are no longer a surprise recap of students' progress.
- Ultimate Frisbee and Badminton starting soon.
- Student Learning Survey - online survey for students in grades 4 and 7 (and 10), parents and staff. Takes place from February - April 2019; previously called "School Satisfaction Survey"; parents will be sent a link to an anonymous online survey about their child's learning, our school in general, etc.


### 2.3. Items to Discuss:

- Liter-less lunches: students are being encouraged to bring lunches containing no litter, and to take home leftovers rather than throwing them out. On hot lunch days, there is an announcement in the morning telling kids which items are recyclable. Reminder to send a sealable container (Tupperware, Ziplock, etc.) for leftovers.

3. Treasury Report \& Final Tally for 2018/2019 Donations Drive - Jennifer W.
3.1. Donations Drive tally: 107 families donated $\mathbf{\$ 1 3 , 5 8 0}$ ! Our best campaign yet! Approx. 33\% participation!

- Annual Fundraising Campaign History:
- 2017/18 Campaign: \$11,697 from 87 families (approx. 25\% participation)
- 2016/17 Campaign: \$10,726 from 74 families (approx. 20\% participation)
- 2015/16 Campaign: $\$ 11,575$ from 93 families (approx. 30\% participation)
- Many thanks to all the generous families who donated - your contributions make a huge difference to our kids' school experience at Peace Arch!
- Several families were able to donate through their work or their union; parents, it's not too late to check with your employer or union - ask if they have a charitable giving/matching program
- While our Donations Drive has officially wrapped up for the purpose of 2018 tax receipts, donations to the PAC or Playground Project are gratefully accepted year-round
3.2. Line items removed from our budget: Plywood Pod signs (being covered by the District); Grade 5 Carnaval not happening.
3.3. QSP magazine subscription fundraiser still running; enter Peace Arch Elementary and student's name for PAC to receive a percentage.

4. Playground - Fundraising/Sponsorship Update - Sean H.
4.1. We submitted a large grant application (\$5k) to the Peace Arch Hospital Foundation's Healthy Community Grant, and hope to hear back within a couple of months
4.2. Fundraising is progressing slowly but surely: from community groups and businesses so far we have raised $\$ 18,200$; this is in addition to $\$ 50 \mathrm{k}$ in savings from the 2016 and 2017 school years, and the expected $\$ 25 \mathrm{k}$ we'll be able to set aside towards the end of this school year.
4.3. Overall playground fundraising to date (including forecast set-aside of $\mathbf{\$ 2 5 k}$ this school year) for Phase 1 and Phase 2: $\$ 93,200$ of our goal of $\$ 150,000$.
4.4. Mathnasium has been in touch with us regarding possible sponsorship
4.5. Half Moon Dentistry is donating $\$ 1,000$ as a bronze sponsor
4.6. Our proposed changes to the design have been submitted to Habitat
4.7. Always looking for more help! Several more parent volunteers needed. PeaceArchPACplayground@gmail.com; need more committee members to continue fundraising, collaborate on design, etc.

## 5. DPAC (District PAC) - Jennifer W.

5.1. Jennifer attended this month's DPAC meeting; it was well-run, and a positive experience!
5.2. Surrey DPAC is looking at amending many of their bylaws, making some positive changes.
5.3. Meeting topic was financial handling of individual PACs; using the District online system for tax receipt issuance.
5.4. DPAC discussion about making individual PACs registered charities; the only school in Surrey District that is a registered charity is Laronde; too many hoops to jump through re. reporting and audits.
5.5. City Councillor Gary Thind was present at the DPAC meeting; he encouraged questions to the School Board.
5.6. Territorial acknowledgements on District website if needed.
5.7. Surrey School District has already purchased licenses for movie night fundraisers; one free movie per school per year.
5.8. PACs and social media: discussion about how PACs are communicating and how effective each method is.
