Treasurer's Report - Jennifer W.

- A lovely thank-you note was read out from Mrs. Frew, Integration Support Teacher, thanking PAC for our annual allocation of \$150 to Integration Support needs and Peace Arch's team of EAs.
- BC Gaming Grant came in higher than last year \$13,104
- Annual Fundraising Donations Drive is currently at \$1,520 from 12 families
- Request for teachers to include reminders for the Donations Drive to be written in agendas periodically
- Suggestion to provide weekly updates for every classroom's window with picture of the playground & thermometer image with fundraising tally; suggestion to have parent pod monitors place notice in each class's window every hot lunch day
- Explanation of **Annual Fundraising Donations Drive** (previously 'Cheque-Writing Campaign'): instead of selling a bunch of stuff we don't need or want, we just ask parents for a simple donation! Cash, cheque, and online donations accepted.
 - Runs Sept-Dec, online donations through the Surrey School District website over \$25 earn a tax receipt: (https://surreyschools.schoolcashonline.com/Fee/Details/829/90/false/true)
 - 2017/18 Campaign: \$11,697 from 87 families (approx. 25% participation)
 - 2016/17 Campaign: \$10,726 from 74 families (approx. 20% participation)
 - 2015/16 Campaign: \$11,575 from 93 families (approx. 30% participation)
- With approximately 350 families at Peace Arch, our goal this year is to significantly increase participation in our annual fundraising effort. PAC funds benefit ALL STUDENTS at Peace Arch from Kindergarten to Grade 7, and we encourage ALL FAMILIES to make a contribution, no matter how big or small.

- had a committee meeting earlier this month thank you to the 5 parents who attended
- need to go out into our community to organize donations and grants

- still working on the final design of the playground; Dave from Habitat is coming later tonight to present new design, and also the second section of the playground due to come out in 2020
- need to figure out how we'll recognize our community donors; what donation amounts will get your name on the plaque?
- Need more committee members to continue fundraising, collaborate on design, etc.

PLAYGROUND COMMITTEE MEETING 7:30pm

- Sean H.: welcome to Dave Warner from Habitat Systems
 - o Presented a new proposal based on feedback from school staff, parents, and students (see next page)
 - o New proposed structure has better ramp accessibility, and provides better space for group play
- 6-8 weeks from once we order to when equipment is delivered; goal is to have all funds in place by late Spring 2019?
- measuring, surveying, digging holes: all done by Habitat
- the supervised install can be done in one Saturday, with help from school parents
 - o Habitat would come on a Wednesday for drilling, etc.
 - on the Friday after school the equipment would be delivered (some parent help needed), install on Sat.
- "pour-in-place" rubber is the premier surface for accessibility = \$25 per square foot
 - o Tire Stewardship BC; early January deadline to apply for a matching grant (50%)
 - o "engineered wood fibre" is what we currently have (wood chips), and it is considered wheel-chair accessible
- Phase 2 for the north playground: a lunar net climbing structure (larger size \$40k, but would require expanding the footprint/ground structure of the area at a cost of approx. \$10k, plus an "Oodle swing" (\$8,000) = approx. \$60k!
 - o large lunar blast can't be a community install; must be installed by Habitat
- we must get out into the community to begin seeking grants and donations from businesses and organizations
 - Supersave Gas; GNF Financial have donated to school playgrounds in the past; Adera, Bosa, Altus; should ask as many local developers as possible; grand opening ceremony, balloons, media, etc... donors want publicity!
- we currently have \$50,000 saved for the playground; after seeing the new proposal tonight, it's clear we will need \$150,000 rather than \$125k. By the end of this school year's PAC fundraising (Hot Lunch, Donations Drive, Spring Fling, etc.), we expect to have \$75k saved, leaving us with another \$75k needed from the community.
