Welcome and introductions by Erin H.

Playground Replacement: Guest Speaker Dave Warner from Habitat Systems

- this company doesn't just sell and build playgrounds; they also assist with lots of support and fundraising ideas, advertising for fundraising, flyers, posters, scratch-cards, etc.
- encouragement to involve the kids in the selection process; voting on a few final designs.
- entire transaction & purchase order goes through the school district; 4-8 weeks from order to delivery.
- can offer us a list of possible grants; will send to Sean.
- Habitat sees a lot of playgrounds being funded these days by corporate donations.
- no swings, no teeter-totters allowed by Surrey School District.
- next steps are to create a preliminary plan and vision for the space we have, and for Habitat to create a few proposals.
- discussion about fundraising for both playgrounds (red/yellow plus old wooden one at north end); fundraising fatigue if we try to fundraise now, and again in a couple years.
- very rough estimate for replacement of southern red/yellow accessible playground: \$150k.
- agreement from PAC to go ahead with using *Habitat Systems* for our playground replacement project.

<mark>Admin Report ~ Mr. Bobrownik</mark>

- Recent Events:
 - \circ $\;$ Terry Fox Run and Cops for Cancer was great; approx. \$500 raised
 - first non-instructional day was Sept 25 and the staff worked on supporting students with challenging behaviour and using reading assessment data to plan appropriate instruction and interventions
 - Grade 6-7 students "Fit Kids" training was great, planning regular circuits and buddy PE classes
 - o Back to School BBQ was lots of fun, good turnout and nice to meet our new staff
 - Orange Shirt Day Sept 29 many learning activities throughout the school, resources were borrowed from District Aboriginal Department (picture books, novels, etc.)
 - Student Photos proofs sent home and orders were due Oct 18th; "Get to Know You" conferences Oct 4-5
 - o Soccer playdays lots of great teamwork and athleticism; volleyball practices have begun
 - o K/1 classes visited the White Rock Firehall; "We Day" today Oct 18 at Rogers Arena
 - Cross-Country regular season wrapped up, only "Mud Run" in two weeks left
 - FSA's are underway for Grades 4 and 7
- Upcoming Events:
 - \circ provincial non-instructional day Oct 20, Curriculum implementation Nov 3
 - $\circ~$ K and K/1 classes to pumpkin patch; WITS presentations for all grades
 - Halloween activities (costume parade); 9:30am for Kindergarten; 10:45 for Grades 1-7
 - o Author presentation for intermediate classes (historical fiction) John Wilson, local Canadian author
 - o photo retakes Thursday, Nov. 2nd; Remembrance Day assembly Thursday, Nov. 9th

- Body Science presentations for parents and students by Saleema Noon; parent night Monday, Nov. 20th, student workshops Thursday, Nov. 23rd by grade groupings (K-1, 2-3, 4-5, 6-7)
- Interim report cards may go out by the end of Oct; go out twice a year, teachers choose the format (may have just been the parent-teacher conference early Oct)
- Items to Discuss:
 - FSA perception by parents (Foundation Skills Assessment): is this seen as a "Grade level" test? Admin has had a higher number of parents excuse their children and are curious about the reason.
 - o in the past the FSAs were administered in the Spring; this year it's happening this fall
 - discussion about reasons for parents opting out of FSA; French Immersion parents worry that the test is in English and puts FI kids at a disadvantage; lots of information from BCTF about opting out
- Technology needs:
 - Priority is 3 more laptops for the 100-pod (Cost approx. \$3,400).
 - Second priority is replacing the iPads and possibly changing carts; iPads for both primary and intermediate would cost \$21,150; two carts if needed cost \$4,200.
 - school's technology budget for the year is approx. \$3,000, but it can be increased with permission from the District would take away from other learning resources though; textbooks, novels, etc.)

Treasurer's Report ~ per Laura C.

• MOTION: to set aside an extra \$15,000 from operating account for playground savings, for a total of \$25,000; moved by Laura C., seconded by Elizabeth M.; all in favour, none opposed; motion passed.

Annual PAC Fundraising Campaign ~ Erin H.

- this year our goal is \$20k, plus increased participation from more families.
- we don't have a current accurate picture of our fundraising tally; don't have a current record of online donations; best guess is approx. \$4,000 as of Oct 18th; should have a better idea by this Friday, and will be able to report next week.

Emergency Preparedness ~ Arin B.

- PAC provisions the storage container in the parking lot full of emergency preparedness supplies; this year we are restocking our expiring food supplies; ideas for where to donate expired rations?? 72hrs of food rations for 550 ppl.
- 24 hrs of rations costs \$1,500; enough rations for 590 people (students and staff)
- this year needed 3 more survival kit backpacks for our three new divisions
- MOTION: to increase the Emergency Preparedness budget to \$2500 (from \$2000) to provide 3 new divisions with survival kit backpacks: moved by Arin B., seconded by Chris M.; all in favour, none opposed, motion passed.
- discussion about who carries the key for the storage container.

- We still need Spring Fling Coordinator (lead the army of Spring Fling volunteers; most Spring Fling roles already filled, just need a boss! We have a whole binder of instructions from years past!)
