- the money is split evenly amongst the school departments, clubs and athletics, the Christmas dinner, grad events and scholarships
- all funds are spent each year
- The gaming grant is not for items funded by the Ministry of Education.

# 2. EPS Activists Presentation - Athena and Katherine (EPS Students)

- The EPS Activists fundraise for charities and community events
- They meet Tuesdays at lunch in Mr. Ellett's room
- Previous fundraising efforts have included the Terry fox foundation, a coat and purse drive
- This Christmas they are organizing an Angel Tree from November 22 December 13 where students adopt a person on the tree and spend \$20-\$30 toward a gift for a person/family in need at Atira House. The goal is to help around 140 families
- Do not wrap the gifts

## 3. Principal's Report - Jeff Johnstone

- On November 14, EPS held a "Hold and Secure" for around 2 hours
- A threat to the school was phoned in, 911 was called immediately and police arrived promptly
- Nearby elementary schools were also put on "hold and 'secure"
- While there was no validity to the threat, emergence protocol was followed
- There is an active ongoing investigation into the matter and there are currently 2 suspects being investigated
- There are no safety concerns moving forward from this event
- The RCMP will put out a media release when ready, hopefully within a week
- Staff and students handled it well
- Parents are reminded to have the Orca App on their phones
- Parents at the PAC meeting would like to know what the security protocol terms mean, for example "hold and secure, shelter in place, lockdown", etc. and have that information readily

available

- Traffic Update: a student was hit in the crosswalk 3 weeks ago but is ok\Safe Schools has attended, observed the crosswalk area and made preliminary suggestions
- The City of Surrey has also observed the impact site and observed and collected data
- RCMP Volunteers have and will hold speed patrol monitoring events in the area
- parent volunteers have been helping at the 134 St. and 136 St. crosswalks by providing visible patrollers with stopsigns and guiding students across the street. Thank you!

- School Athletics for fall are in full swing and many teams are posting excellent results including in Cross-Country Running, Volleyball and Soccer
- Many EPS students earned provincial scholarships and EPS scored very well for overall scholarships
- EPS was nominated for the Philanthropy Award for the Cycle for ER event in the spring. To date, EPS has raised over \$275,000 in the last 10 years toward charity
