Dear Panorama Park Parents and Families,



Litter



Schools are our second home and it is important to keep our school sanitary and clutter-free. One way to do so is to avoid littering. Littering in schools is harmful not only to the students and staff in the vicinity, littered rubbish could also affect the people, animals, and the environment outside the school premises. Factors like wind and rain allow waste to travel and reach great distances. Thus, please help keep our school grounds litter free. Parking





A few friendly reminders about our parking lot to keep our students safe and make drop off and pick up easy and stress free:

- Please give yourself time to drop off and pick up your child.
- Our parking lot is for staff only, with some spaces for visitor parking
- Please do not double park in front of cars in the drop off area and wait for your children. Rather, please leave the lot and line up to make another pass and meet your child. Cars that are idling in front of the school will be asked to circle around and come back into the lot.
- When dropping off and picking up students in front of the school, please have children exit and enter vehicles on the passenger side.
- We encourage parents to park off site, meet your child at their classroom door or a designated meeting spot, and then walk with your children to your vehicle.
- Please follow the parking signs such as, No Parking in front of drop off loop and No Left Turn signs
- Please keep your speed slow in and around our school. Thank you for your cooperation.



Kindergarten Childhood Experiences Questionnaire (CHEQ)

Dear Kindergarten Parents/Caregivers:

Our school District is partnering with the Human Early Learning Partnership (HELP), a rese arch institute at the University of British Columbia, to do the Childhood Experiences Questionnaire (CHEQ). The CHEQ is an online questionnaire completed by parents and caregivers at the start of the Kindergarten school year. It focuses on experiences your child has had over the last few years that are strongly linked to children's health and well-being, education, and social outcomes. The CHEQ also includes COVID-19 related questions to help us understand the secondary impacts of the pandemic on children and families. As a parent/caregiver of a Kindergarten student in the Surrey School District, you are invited to fill out the CHEQ this fall. It will be open until October 31st, 2021.

The information from the CHEQ is shared with our school District and early years community to strengthen programs and services for families. Our school and Kindergarten teachers can also use it to better understand the different kinds of experiences children had before starting Kindergarten so that we can support them better.

The questionnaire does not assess your child's skills or abilities, or your parenting. The CHEQ is simple and easy to complete and will take approximately 30 minutes of your time. Your participation is voluntary.

When you click the link to the CHEQ you will be presented with a consent form available in <u>English</u>, <u>관</u>, <u>中国人</u>, <u>中國人</u>, <u>희(س)</u>, <u>Français</u>, 日本, 한국인, <u>ਪੰਜਾਬੀ</u>, <u>Español</u>, <u>Tagalog</u> and <u>Tiếng Việt</u>. It is up to you if you wish to participate and you will have the option to withdraw. **Please note, the CHEQ is available in English**, ਪੰਜਾਬੀ, and 中国人.

HELP is responsible for keeping CHEQ data safe; your child's personal information is kept in a secure research environment at the University of British Columbia.

Dress for the Weather

Foundation Skills Assessments (FSA's)



FSA's are administered annually to grade 4 and 7 students. This year Panorama Park will participate from October 18 - November 4. These assessments include literacy and numeracy components and have online as well as hard copy written sections. FSA's are reviewed and assessed by District teams according to specific criteria outlined in the tasks. They are sent home to parents in late November / early December.
