ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance and punctuality are vital for success at North Surrey for the following reasons:

1. **Your child's learning:** Teachers carefully plan lesson sequences to optimize student learning. Missing classes negatively affects students' ability to learn which is detrimental to achievement. The first minutes of class are often the most important because they create the context for the entire lesson. Students who miss the beginning of class may find themselves struggling to catch up for the entire block.
2. **Respect:** Showing up and being on time is a sign of respect for teachers and classmates.
3. **Habits for life:** Showing up and being on time are keystone habits that affect everything a person does. Students who do not attend regularly or frequently arrive late are less likely to submit assignments on time or at all. Attendance and punctuality in school send the message that school is important.

We understand there are times and unavoidable reasons for being absent, arriving late, or leaving early. We are asking for your help in minimizing such occurrences. We appreciate anything you can do to help your child attend their classes in full. Specifically, we ask you please:

1. **Contact** the school if your child will be missing any or all of their classes
 - ✓ Please provide: **Student Number, Student name** (first and last), and **Reason for absence** (*illness, appointment, parent excused*)
 - Phone/Voicemail any day or time 604-581-4433, *Press "1"
 - E-mail any day or time to NorthSurreyAbsentee@SurreySchools.ca
 - ✓ If student is arriving late or leaving early, please remind them to check in/out at office
2. **Check** your child's attendance on MyEdBC regularly (see page 15 for instructions).
3. If you receive an automatic phone call informing you of your child's unexcused absence, check in with your child, check MyEd BC, and/or email the teacher for more information.
4. **Implement** a reasonable bedtime and keep devices out of your child's bedroom to help them sleep.
5. **Connect** with your child's Vice-Principal or Counsellor with any concerns. We're here to support you.

Our hope is that together we can support all students in regular attendance and punctuality leading to their long-term success. The phones are quite busy in the mornings, so if the office staff do not answer the phone, please leave a voicemail or send an email.

VACATION / EXTENDED ABSENCE

If your child is going to be away from school for *5 days or more*, please have them pick up an Extended Vacation Absence Notification Form from the office, or it can be printed at home from our school website under 'Parents/Forms' or here [Vacation Form](#).

This form needs to be filled by parent/guardian and all the student's teachers. Once all signatures have been completed, please hand in to the office for Principal's authorization.

Forms should be completed at least one week prior to absence.



District & School Course Fees 2024-25

Parents and students are advised of the following optional fees and workbook pricing for the 2024-2025 school year. The school will provide the basic materials and resources necessary for students to meet the learning outcomes for each course. Students will need to continue to provide their own basic supplies and equipment for their own personal use such as paper, writing tools, calculators, notebooks, gym attire and musical instruments. Workbooks may be provided to students on loan, or they may be purchased outright. Some courses such as textiles, and woodwork provide students with the option of using different or better-quality materials which they may bring from home or purchase from the school at cost. Students can expect a cost for participation on sports teams which is dependent on the number of games or tournaments played, the travel involved, fees for referees, and fees to the provincial bodies that organize these events. Every attempt is made to keep costs to a minimum.

SCHOOL CASH ONLINE

We are happy to offer School Cash Online, which provides you with the convenience of paying online for school items such as school fees, trips, club/athletic fees and spirit wear. To Register Online:

Step 3: After you receive the confirmation email, select the "click here" option, login in and add each of your children to your household account.

Once you have registered your child, you will be able to see when they have a new item posted online for purchase. You also have the option to be notified whenever your child has a new school expense due, so you do not have to worry about missing a deadline.



SCHOOL FEES ONLINE PAYMENT

School District #36 (Surrey) preferred method of payment for school fees is our *School Cash OnLine* System. This system is safe and efficient and reduces the need to send your student to school with cash or cheques. **North Surrey Secondary accepts *School Cash OnLine* payments OR payments in the office.**

Click on "Get Started Today" (For security reasons your password requires 8 characters including one uppercase letter, one lowercase letter and a number)

Step 2: Confirm Your Email

A registration confirmation email will be forwarded to you. Click on the link provided inside the email to confirm your email and *School Cash OnLine* account. The confirmation link will open the *School Cash OnLine* site prompting you to sign into your account. Use your email address and password just created with your account.

Step 3: Find Student (*this step will connect your children to your account*)

- a) Enter the School Board Name
- b) Enter the School Name
- c) Enter your child's Name & Birth Date (Student number is not required)
- d) Select Continue
- e) On the next page confirm that you are related to the child in the Agree box and select Continue
- f) Your child has been added to your account

Step 4: View Items or Add Another Student

- a) Add Another Student - 5 children can be added to one parent account
- b) View Items For Students - A listing of available items for purchase will be displayed

Payments may be made by

Credit Card – Pay with Visa or MasterCard by entering your credit card number, CVV number, card expiry date and billing information

eCheck – An electronic version of a paper cheque used to make payments online. A chequing or saving account is required

myWallet – an online wallet that can be loaded to hold funds and pay for your child's fees. Can be used to pay current fees or school fees at a later date.

CODE OF CONDUCT

All students and staff at North Surrey have the right to work within a school which is safe, caring and orderly. All students and staff at have the right to a school which is free of:

- harassment and discrimination (this includes verbal abuse, bullying, sexual harassment and/or racism);
- bullying, cyber-bullying, harassment, threat and intimidation, violence in any form;

- verbal, physical or sexual abuse/exploitation;

- violence and intimidation, drugs, alcohol, vaping, weapons or replica weapons (including fireworks, and water or toy guns)

SURREY SCHOOLS CELLPHONE AND PERSONAL DIGITAL DEVICES POLICY

Personal Digital Devices are defined as any personal electronic device that can be used to communicate or to access the internet, such as a cell phone, tablet, laptop, or smartwatch. These devices are important tools which can be used to enhance learning and prepare children for the world in which they will work and live. Personal digital devices provide support for children who rely on these tools to access learning through services such as translation, adaptations for Individual Education Plans, medical support, health needs, or to provide equity of access to resources. The classroom teacher is responsible for the learning environment in the classroom, for guiding children to use personal digital devices appropriately, and for determining when personal digital devices should be used.

The safe and responsible use of personal digital devices is expected by all Surrey School District students, employees, volunteers, parents, guardians, and community members who are on school district property or interacting with students or staff. This includes the following:

- Those using personal digital devices need to abide by the school code of conduct as well as all Provincial and Federal laws and the British Columbia Human Rights Code. This includes not using personal digital devices to engage or participate in bullying or harassment, discrimination, or defamation of character.
- At both elementary and secondary schools, personal digital devices can be used during class time to enhance learning at the direction of the classroom teacher. These devices should be used in a way that is respectful of other's learning and does not distract others in terms of light, sound, or by other means.
- At elementary schools, it is expected that personal digital devices are to be put away during non-class time such as recess and lunch. Exceptions to this are for students who need digital devices for medical or health reasons, translation, accessibility, or other student-specific reasons.
- Personal Digital Devices should not be used during lock down procedures or drills. The use of personal digital devices during this time may impact the emergency safety response.
- Surrey School District staff and students should not be recorded, visually or audibly, for any reason without their prior consent.
- The Surrey School District is not responsible for lost, missing, or damaged personal digital devices that students choose to bring to school.

VALUABLES

Valuables brought to the school are the responsibility of each student. The school is not responsible for the loss, damage, or destruction of items brought to the school that are not secured in the student's locker, in which the locker combination is not shared. Please ensure your children are aware that items should never be left unattended at the school, and instead secured in their locker. Lock combinations are never to be shared and are the personal information of each student.

BIKE AND SCOOTER RACKS

We have a number of bike racks available at the school. Ensure your bike is locked up securely to the racks provided. Thieves target bikes that are easily removed so make sure you are using both a U Lock *and* cable to secure your bike to the rack.

PARKING LOTS AND SURROUNDING DRIVE LANES

STUDENT VEHICLE PARKING



Student parking is available at North Surrey Secondary and requires students to register their vehicles at the office.

Please complete the Student Parking Registration Form available on the [North Surrey Secondary website](#). Forms can also be picked up from the office at the student window.

Please review the information and regulations carefully. Parents/Guardians and students should discuss and understand together the information on the form.

PICK UP AND DROP OFF

Please be mindful when picking up or dropping off students in the parking lot. **There are signs of where parking is not permitted as these areas are reserved in case of an emergency.**

Please use the visitor parking spots to park while you wait for your child. As with any school, the parking lot gets extremely busy at pick up and drop off, and we appreciate your patience and understanding.

As our school is located at a main intersection, please ensure to always allow for extra time to get to the school for pick up and drop off, to keep everyone safe and ensure smooth flow of traffic.

MYEDUCATION BC (MyEdBC) PARENT & STUDENT PORTAL ACCESS



If you/your child is new to North Surrey, once the office has processed new students for the school year, you will receive an email to the email provided from the Student Verification Form (parents) or your Surrey Schools email account (students). In that email you will receive a temporary password for logging into MyEd BC.

If you/your child is returning to North Surrey, MyEdBC access stays the same year after year, until graduation. If you have trouble logging in, please reference the information on the North Surrey Secondary website under "[MyEdBC – Parent Portal](#)".

On the [MyEdBC](#) page on the North Surrey Secondary website there are links to the multiple pages within MyEdBC that will assist in navigating how to access: Attendance Records, Learning Updates (previously called Report Cards), Class Schedule, and Resetting Your Password.

Should the 'Reset my password' link not work, please email the school at NorthSurrey@SurreySchools.ca and provide your child's name and student number. Please be aware this may take approximately 24 hours (not including weekends and holidays) to have reset.

HEALTH & SAFETY SURREY SCHOOLS – ILLNESS

Protect Yourself and Others

[Surrey Schools' Communicable Disease Prevention and Response Plan](#) outlines the following measures that apply to everyone in Surrey Schools, including all facilities and activities, to help prevent the spread of communicable diseases:

- Keep up to date with vaccinations and boosters.
- Promote and practice personal hygiene practices such as [hand hygiene](#), [covering coughs and sneezes](#) and not sharing items that contact the mouth.
 - We have a limited supply of hand sanitizer at the school, please ensure to have a personal supply for your child, perhaps for their backpack.
- Do a health check and stay home if ill.
 - A health check means a person regularly checking to ensure they (or their child) are not experiencing symptoms of illness that would limit their ability to participate fully in regular activities before coming to school to prevent spread of communicable diseases within the school setting.
 - For a *fever*, stay home and away from others until the fever is gone without the use of medicines that reduce fever, and feel well enough to return to regular activities.
 - For undiagnosed *vomiting and diarrhea*, stay home 24 hours, or the next day, since the last episode.
- If a student or other person develops symptoms of illness at school and is unable to participate in regular activities, they should be supported to go home until their symptoms have improved.
- [Wear a mask](#) if returning to school or work with ongoing symptoms.
 - One may still have symptoms but feel well enough to return to school or work. Wearing a mask acts as a barrier and, in combination with the above measures, can help prevent the spread of respiratory infections.
 - Some people may choose to continue to wear a mask because they are more comfortable wearing a mask or because they, or someone in their family, may be at higher risk and want to take extra precautions. Be respectful of everyone whether they choose to wear a mask or not. It is important to be kind and respectful of other's choices.

Vaccinations remain the best defence against COVID-19 and influenza.

Stay home if you are not feeling well or are experiencing symptoms including fever and/or chills, recent onset of coughing, or diarrhea.

The general guidelines are:

- **For fever:** stay home until you do not have a fever and feel well enough to return to your regular activities.
- **For undiagnosed vomiting and diarrhea:** Stay home until there has been 24 hours since your last episode.

Staff, students or visitors can attend school if their symptoms are consistent with a previously diagnosed health condition (e.g., seasonal allergies) or symptoms have improved enough to where you feel well enough to return to regular activities, and any fever has resolved without the use of fever-reducing medication (e.g. acetaminophen, ibuprofen).

If a staff member, student or visitor develops symptoms of illness while at school and is unable to participate in regular activities, they should go home until their symptoms have improved.



The decision to wear a mask or face covering is a personal choice for everyone. This choice will be supported and treated with respect in all our schools. Disposable masks will continue to be available at our sites for those who wish to use them.
