Dear Parents,

We hope you are well and enjoyed the beautiful weather this Easter long weekend.

Today you received a message from Jordan Tinney, Superintendent of Surrey Schools. In his message, he pointed out we are just 10 days into converting schools to learning online. As we are self-isolating at home, it may feel to some that more time has passed than 10 days. In moving through the days and weeks, it is important to remember we are all in this together.

We know that students and families are living in unique circumstances and the expectations for what school looks like varies greatly within the Salish Community. We appreciate your understanding and patience as we work through the complexities of moving our school online. Technology is great until there is an issue like the one we experienced having the Grade 8s and 9s log onto TEAMS at the same time. Students are adjusting to the technology and are starting to realize that class expectations for behaviour are the same online as in a physical classroom.

When we first learned that schools would close after Spring Break, there was confusion regarding the expectations for students to complete work assigned after the Break. Many parents and families heard from Education Minister Flemming in his statement that students would move on to the next grade level. He has since clarified his statement to include that students need to complete the work assigned or they will not move onto the next grade. We still have students who have not logged into TEAMS or met with their teachers online. Teachers have designed assignments in two-week periods. The assignments designed so that students spend approximately 3-5 hours per week to complete the work. It is imperative that students check in with their teachers as they can guide and teach you so you are able to complete the work.
