Dear LA Matheson Secondary Parents & Guardians.

We hope this letter finds everyone in good health. Our society and our lives have had to change drastically to help stop the spread of COVID-19.

The purpose of this letter is to communicate important information moving into week three of our current context of 'school.' The LA Matheson staff are missing their students and teaching their classes. In the past two weeks, we had to create a new learning system to be delivered in the homes of our students. We thank you for your ongoing patience as we develop new tools and lessons that can be accessed in a home setting.

Please read the important information below.

Every school in the province is creating new systems to meet the Ministry of Education's priorities during the suspension of in-class instruction. The first system was to set up a method of communication between staff, then determining a platform for teachers to connect with students. I know there is a lot of confusion about the various platforms teachers are using (student personal emails, SurreySchools student email, Microsoft 365 Teams, Zoom, Schoology, etc.). Our preference is Microsoft 365 Teams, which is free for all Surrey students when they access it through their Surrey Schools email account. Teachers will determine the best platform for their classes and students.

Please make a note of the following:

- 1. ALL teachers should have made contact with their students likely by email. If a teacher did NOT contact your child, please email <u>lamatheson@surreyschools.ca</u>
- 2. If you have new contact information (Student Name, Student Number, address, phone or email), please email <u>lamatheson@surreyschools.ca</u>

One more critical communication system is **phone calls**. Since teachers are using their home/cell phones, they have been asked to 'turn off' Caller ID to keep their phone number private. If your family receives a call with a "blocked number," the caller may be a teacher. If your phone has a feature to block unknown numbers, you may want to turn this feature off.

Please expect this week, at some point; teachers will be providing the first lesson/assignment for their students. Please be mindful we are asking teachers to start slow and not to overwhelm students and families in this new learning context. We will continue to adjust as we head into the following weeks. A few action items for this week that may pertain to your child or family.

- 1. Need Access to Technology? If you are a family who does NOT have access to any technology, we ask you to contact Ms. Vicki Mckay mckay v@surreyschools.ca to set up a time to borrow a device. There is a form that requires completion. For now, this offer is for families who do not have any technology at home.
- Essential Student Items in Lockers some families have inquired about retrieving essential items from a student locker. What is essential? – medication, orthodontic appliance, laptop, cell phone. What is NOT essential? – binders, workbooks, and textbooks. Teachers have been told to expect students do NOT have their textbooks and binders



To obtain an essential item, please email <u>lamatheson@surreyschools.ca</u>. We need the <u>name of the student and</u> <u>what is the indispensable item for pick up from their locker</u>. Pick up will start this **Tuesday, April 14 – 17, from 9:00** – **1:00 pm**. <u>If the email is sent by noon the day prior</u>, we will have the item(s) in a bag with their name on it by the front entrance. There will be a lineup outside the main entrance. Please remember to follow <u>social distancing</u> <u>guidelines</u>.

Digital Citizenship

With the move to using various online platforms, we need to remind all students and parents about being good DIGITAL CITIZENS. Whether your child is using email, MS Teams, or ZOOM, the expectation of communicating respectfully still exists. We expect all our students to continue to interact and communicate as they would if they were in the classroom at school. Parents, please monitor and supervise when and how your child is working online and being appropriate. When working online, it is best to ensure your child is in a common room in the house, not in a bedroom.
