



PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Welcome to Matheson and the 2019-2020 School Year!

I hope that everyone has enjoyed a safe summer of relaxation and renewal.

On behalf of the entire staff, I am happy to welcome everyone to Matheson.

Matheson has an incredibly safe, caring and nurturing learning environment. The staff, students and parents work together to help support this environment.

This nurturing learning environment is the bedrock of all learning within the school. If students do not feel safe, they cannot learn to their full potential. So, we are very fortunate to have this unique learning environment.

The nurturing learning environment allowed us to continue to care for our students and start looking at how our students are learning. Throughout last year, we spoke with our staff and students (and parents) on how our students need to take greater ownership for their learning. Ownership of learning means that students need to take responsibility for showing up on time and doing the work they need to do, without being told to do it by staff or parents.

Our staff is committed to preparing our students for the modern world. A world that will require our students to be lifelong learners. Our students will enter a world that is changing at an exponential rate. Our graduating students will need to be able to demonstrate their ownership for their learning throughout their entire life.

With this in mind, we are looking forward to a few changes for the 2019 - 2020 school year.

Some of the changes are:

- A new grade 9 schedule. This new schedule allows our grade 9 students to investigate two different academies throughout the year. This new grade 9 schedule will give students a firm overview of various subjects we offer and will allow students to gain some voice, choice and agency in their learning.
- We are also excited to pilot an advisory program in grade 8. Students will meet with Advisory teachers twice a week. There will be 15-20 students per advisory, and it will allow students to share their learning in a safe place with a trusted adult. This advisory pilot is another opportunity to offer student voice, choice, and agency.
- Focusing on student voice, choice and agency is another initiative for us this upcoming school year. It merely means that students will start to have a say (voice) in how they learn, how they choose (choice) to demonstrate their learning, and the ability to take ownership (agency) for their learning.

LOCKER ASSIGNMENT

Locker distribution for grades 9 - 12 for next year will be done through our School App. Through our App, students will open the locker link and follow the directions to sign up and choose

a locker. Grade 8 students will be assigned lockers through their semester one homeroom class.

Note that all student fees must be paid before a locker combination will be given out. Students wishing to use lockers during PE need to bring a second lock to use for the PE lockers.

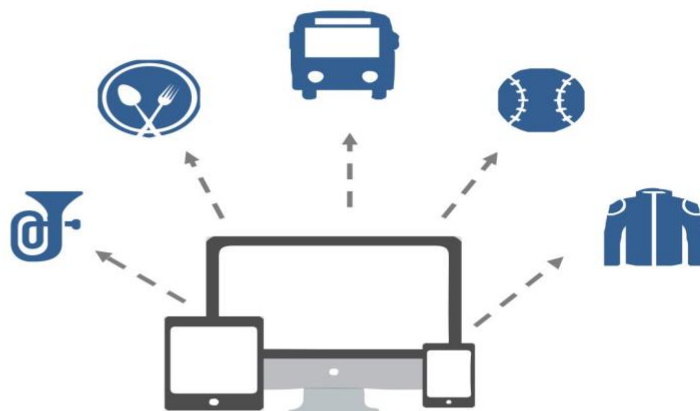
