### **Clarification**

#### **Building Envelope**

After a very long delay (awaiting permits from the City of Surrey), our construction is slated to begin in mid February. The first step is removal of bushes/trees/plants around the perimeter; other than the trees that have fencing around them.

#### Future Projections

Latimer Elementary is in a growth cycle. We received our preliminary projections and anticipate approximately 570 students in the fall, over 600 the following year. This does mean that we can expect additional portables. In addition, it will be even more essential that parents do not use any of the parking stalls in front of the school as we will require ALL of the spots to accommodate staff. The East Zone is growing rapidly!

#### **Bullying Checklist**

Latimer Road has encountered an increase in cyber bulling this year which has a direct effect on the school culture. In the past, it was not the District's mandate to address bullying that occurred off-site. Changes have been made to when it comes to "devises" and the adverse affects that can occur due to inappropriate messaging, Snap Chat, false accounts being set up, Musically App etc. If the cyber bulling is negatively impacting the students at school, the Principal and VP are authorized by the board under the School Act to suspend a student.
