School Growth and Class Organizations

Latimer Road continues to be in a growth cycle. We are anticipating 560 + students this fall. Many changes occur between this time of year and the end of the first week of September. All class organizations are

temporary at this stage. Please understand that student placement is a complex task for teachers and administration and we are unable to take requests from parents for their children to be matched up with friends or with particular teachers.

As the teachers are directly responsible for the programing of designated students, please know that the District Policy is that all communication is to go through the teacher, not the support staff (ABA/EA's). Parents play a significant and fundamental role in helping us to create a culture and environment whereby students thrive. Dress Code/Expectations
