Cellphones & Learning Environment:

We've learned new information about the detrimental effects of personal smartphones on student's ability to focus in class. This year, I will not be allowing students to have their phones on them during instructional time, including during bathroom breaks. Phones will be placed in bins and kept at the front of the classroom and will be returned at the end of the block. I will provide "phone break times" from time to time. Our class priorities include learning, healthy interaction, prioritizing responsibilities, respectful tone, safety, and productivity.

Additionally, you will be expected to actively participate in this course, meaning sharing your thoughts and ideas, listening to others and respecting their viewpoints, and being quiet when others are speaking. There will be individual work, group work, and class presentations throughout the semester.

English 10 is an important course and you will all learn in different ways. I hope to make this experience enjoyable and rewarding for you all. You will need to take responsibility for how you act and what you achieve.
