#### **Counsellor's Corner:**

How To Build Confidence in Our Students:

1. Provide unconditional acceptance (not to be confused with unconditional approval). When students misbehave, provide correction while being clear that the student is still accepted and a welcome part of the classroom community.

2. Give praise when praise is due! For some students, it's a challenge -- try to "catch" them doing something right.

3. Help students set realistic goals that match their abilities. Not everyone can achieve an A, but everyone can do their personal best with support.

4. Model positive self-talk. Let students see how positive self-talk works. If you make a mistake, use it as an opportunity to demonstrate how we recover from our mistakes.

5. Teach resilience. A failure on one assignment does not equal failure in life. Help show students how they can "bounce back".

6. Encourage independence and adventure. Provide safe opportunities for students to experiment with their learning, and make fantastic learning mistakes!

7. Set rules and be consistent. Students will feel safer to explore, make mistakes, and be creative in an environment that is predictable and has boundaries.

We will review our format/systems for next year in order to increase student participation.







Speaking of Course Selection... the process for building next year's 2019/20 schedule has begun! Our first step in structuring next year's timetable is to gather students' course requests. With this, our Counselling and Admin teams will be visiting Grade 10 Career Life Explorations (CLE) classes this week. Please see the attached schedule of all of our Course Selection activities. Students will be guided through this process to ensure they understand their graduation requirements and all of their options at Fleetwood Park Secondary. All students will then be entering their course requests into the online student portal in MyEdBC, with the assistance of Counselling/Admin.

Please note that our <u>Course Selection Booklet</u> is now published and available on our website under the Counselling Department page. It is an excellent document with much information on all available courses at our school.



As we enter into the Course Selection process, it is necessary to remind students of the importance of careful decisionmaking. Students will have the opportunity to ask our counsellors/staff questions about potential courses and are also encouraged to review choices with parents/guardians. There will also be an opportunity to verify course requests after they have been entered into the system. Significant time, care and attention should be devoted to this process. The school will ensure that all students are highly supported.

Students are also reminded that your course requests are used to build next year's timetable and will ultimately determine staffing levels and teaching assignments. <u>Once our 2019-20 timetable has been constructed and staffed, based upon this data, there will be very limited opportunity for students to change their courses</u>. Choose your courses wisely now and know that unless you have a missing graduation requirement, (which should not occur with wise planning), we will be unable to rebuild our timetable, or change your courses, in the summer and/or Fall. **Please choose your courses carefully!**
