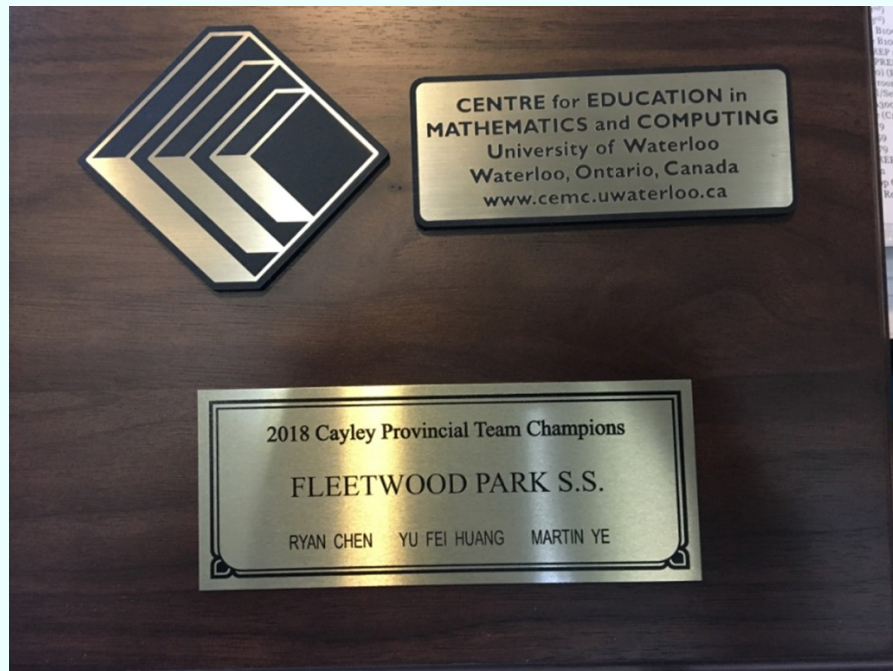
In the middle of all of this excitement, we also coordinated this year's Advanced Placement Calculus Exam. Our students were working hard and making us proud! Good luck!
