This Week at Fleetwood Park

<u>Principal's Message: November 20 - 24</u>

Hello and happy Thursday to all Fleetwood Park Secondary staff, students, parents/guardians and friends. It has been an interesting and enjoyable week at the school, and I am happy to be able to share a few highlights!

On Monday, several of Ms. Snodden's students attended the Neuroscience symposium at UBC. This is Ms. Snodden's description of this fascinating field trip.

Students first attended a keynote presentation by Dr. Cheryl Wellington, a professor from the faculty of medicine, who went over the various components of the brain, what concussions are and how they affect the brain, and finally the teenage brain. Then we had the opportunity to go to the Belkin Art Gallery on campus to view the drawings of the brain done by Santiago Ramón y Cajal (1852-1934), who was a neuroscientist renowned for his discovery of neuron cells and their structure. After lunch we attended a neuroanatomy demo where one of the anatomy professors provided us with an in depth look at a real human brain, its parts and what they each do. Finally, we did a tour of two neuroscience labs. One was a clinical lab where we were shown some of the tasks the researchers do with the elderly population to test their working memory and also how brain activity is monitored while doing various tasks. The second lab was a research lab where post-doctorate researchers explained their current research on neurons and microglia to us and showed us some of the imaging they have captured. It was all very interesting!



On Monday afternoon we met with our Department Heads. Although difficult to believe, we have now initiated our planning for next year's timetable. Department Heads have been tasked with a review of our current courses and asked for their recommendations for revisions and for new courses for next year. As described in the latest announcement from the Ministry of Education, we will be fully implementing the new Grade 10 curriculum in the fall. Many departments will also pilot new courses for the grade 11 and 12 curriculum. Our review of future course offerings is a very important first step in building next year's timetable. We will begin the course selection process with our grade 10 "CLE" students in January after we have finalized the courses that will be offered. I would like to thank all department heads for your very important leadership in the creation of our Course Selection booklet.

This week we have had numerous special presentations. There has been a wide variety of unique and powerful learning opportunities for our students. On Tuesday, we welcomed Mr. Jordan Buda from the Surrey District's Safe School's Department and the Surrey RCMP Anti-Gang unit, to give a special presentation to our Grade 8 students. They provided a very serious message with valuable information to our youngest Dragons about the dangers of gangs, the importance of their decisions, and the possible ramifications of their actions.



On Wednesday, we hosted MADD, Mothers Against Drunk Driving, to deliver a powerful media presentation to our grade 11 and 12 students about the dangers and consequences of drunk driving. Thank you to our Career Education Department for your work in organizing these presentations.





Also on Wednesday afternoon, our PE students were offered a fun and challenging fitness workout as Ms. Chong ran a very energetic Zumba class for our students!





Today, Friday and Saturday our Senior Boy's Soccer team will be competing at the British Columbia Provincial Soccer Championships. The tournament is in Burnaby, and we will be there to cheer our team on!

The team has had such an outstanding season, and we wish them the very best in competing against the top teams in the province. Good luck Dragons! NOTE: This morning the boys won their first game with a very impressive 3 - 0 victory against McMath Secondary.

On Friday our Senior Music students will have the opportunity to play for an international audience. We will be live-streaming to a group in Criel-Sur-Mer France as part of a Canadian Christmas Market event. It should be a fascinating experience.





The "Lunch with the Principal" student focus group will begin on Friday. I am looking forward to meeting with a few students every month for lunch and conversation.
