

Provincial Exams ID Requirements: Walk-In Students

Identification requirements for walk-in students have been clarified by the Ministry of Education.

Students who cannot identify themselves satisfactorily will be refused entry to the exam room. It is the responsibility of the student to provide acceptable photo ID. It is the responsibility of exam administration staff to ensure that the student wishing to write the exam provides one of the following noted pieces of ID.

Acceptable Identification

Students who are not known to exam administration staff **MUST PROVIDE**, if possible, one piece of government-issued photo ID from the list below: Please note: ***GO Cards are not acceptable.***

- BC Driver's License or Learners' License
- BC Services Card
- Combination Driver's License and BC Services Card
- BC Identification (BCID) card (with expiry date)
- Passport
- US passport card
- Canadian or US Driver's License
- Permanent Resident Card
- Secure Certificate of Indian Status
- Native Status Card
- Canadian Citizenship Card – with photo
- Canadian Forces ID
- Naturalization Certificate
- NEXUS Card
- Parole Certificate ID
- Police Identification
- DND photo Identification Card

If a student does not have any of the above ID but...

1. comes from a school that uses **MyEd**, they must obtain from their home school, the top part only of the MyEd Student Information with Photo report, add their PEN and take it to the exam site.
2. comes from a school that uses **CIMS**, they should log in to their Student Connect account and produce a page with photo ID on it and take it to the exam site.
3. comes from a school that uses **DRUMS**, they must obtain a sheet from their home school with the student's name, PEN and photograph and take it to the exam site.
