On average, schools in Surrey will consume between 600—1,500 sheets of paper per student this year. As a whole, the district will use 373 tonnes of paper that will either be recycled or thrown out.

Use Recycled Content

Approximately **80%** of all paper used in the district already has **30%** recycled content. By **avoiding the use of virgin paper**, each year we could save:



240 trees

60 Tonnes of CO₂



Using paper with recycled content reduces the need to harvest trees. Recycled paper also uses less energy, reducing carbon emissions and producing less unwanted by-products
