Dear Parents or Guardians,

We are excited to share that our Board of Education has been successful in advancing a substantial capital program in South Surrey, particularly in the Grandview area and east of Highway 99.

The opening of Edgewood Elementary, Douglas Elementary and Grandview Heights Secondary, have significantly increased the capacity for students in the region. In addition to the new schools, the Board also has completed an addition at Pacific Heights Elementary, and we have additions underway at Sunnyside Elementary and Morgan Elementary. Finally, on the construction horizon is the new Ta'talu Elementary which will be near the corner of 20th Avenue and 165A Street.

With all of the new schools and additions to existing sites, we believe that there is now the capacity to expand French Immersion and would welcome the chance to explore this further with more details including a final destination for a program.

The district believes that a program could be started at Pacific Heights Elementary in September 2022, beginning with an early primary program, grades to be determined, with a view to grow by one new division each year to grade 7. As there is rapid growth and development in this community, the final destination of the program would be determined by September 2024 to align with the opening of Ta'talu Elementary, with the program then residing at one of these two schools who are in close proximity to each other and who both serve the populations east of Highway 99.

The French Immersion Program would continue in grade 8 at Earl Marriott Secondary School (joining the other zone's FRIMM Programs) and as with all choice programs, bussing would not be included.

This letter is to explore interest in a new French Immersion program. If you would be interested in a spot next year, in Kindergarten or Grade 1, please fill out the attached form in the link provided. This will give the district the necessary information to bring the community's interest back to the board for a final decision at the December Board meeting.

KEY SYMPTOMS OF ILLNESS	WHAT TO DO

INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL:	WHAT TO DO
INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL: Have you returned from travel outside Canada in the last 14 days?	WHAT TO DO If yes: All students and staff who have travelled outside of Canada are required to self- quarantine for 14 days after arrival under both provincial and federal orders. This includes students who are attending school from abroad. Students from outside of Canada should plan to arrive in Canada at least two weeks before they are scheduled to attend school to adhere to the selfquarantine orders.
