SCHOOL CODE OF CONDUCT

All members of Frost Road are expected to be responsible citizens, respecting and appreciating our individual differences. It is our belief that all Frost Road members have the responsibility and the right to work, learn and play in a positive, caring and safe environment. Staff has developed a behaviour matrix using the 3 R's that can be found on the following page. This matrix demonstrates the **Acceptable Behaviour Expectations** for Frost Road.



Behavioural expectations are taught and reviewed throughout the year. Students are responsible for following the school's expectation when:

- traveling to and from the school
- during the school's regular hours (inside the building and on the grounds)
- at any school sponsored function (field trips, sports, regardless of location)

SAFE AND CARING SCHOOLS

Are free from acts of: bullying, cyber-bullying, harassment, threat, intimidation, violence in any form, abuse in any form, discrimination in any form, theft, vandalism, and retribution against a person who has reported incidents.

Do not tolerate the presence of: intoxicating or banned substances, weapons or replica (toy) weapons and explosives, and intruders or trespassers. All visitors to the school must first report to the office.

Will provide consequences for UNACCEPTABLE BEHAVIOUR which consists of: rudeness, swearing, fighting (including play fighting), lack of respect for others, teasing, throwing objects (rocks, sticks, snowballs, etc.), defiant behaviour, insolence, running the halls, vandalism or destruction of property, unauthorized leaving the school grounds and littering.

MISUSE OF ELECTRONIC DEVICES/COMPUTERS

 School computers and other electronic devices are only to be used for school/education related activities. They are not permitted for social networking, gaming, illegal, obscene or inappropriate purposes. Inappropriate use includes, but is not limited to, attempts to vandalize, gain unauthorized access to data or another person's account or resources, and sharing of data without personal or parental consent as appropriate.

 Recording of visual images is not permissible at school unless permission has been received by the classroom

teacher with respect to a classroom project.

- Students are to be aware that they may be subject to discipline (or, if applicable, confiscation of personal property) for misuse of any technology, if it negatively impacts the school environment.
- Misuse of district technology services will lead to suspension of user privileges and possible disciplinary or legal action.

CONSEQUENCES

Consequences will be applied in a fair and consistent manner, respecting individual rights, responsibilities, age and maturity.

Unacceptable behaviour typically has the following consequences:

- record of misconduct
- discussion using problem solving
- written assignment/time out "sheet"
- loss of privileges
- parental involvement
- confiscation of inappropriate articles
- behavioural contract
- short term suspension up to 5 days (in-school or at home)
- Long term suspension (over 5 days)
- Consultation with police
- expulsion
