

School Supplies

School Supply lists are posted on our website. Copies are also available in our school office. Students will not need to bring any supplies the first day and only limited supplies for our first week.

First Day Procedures

School begins on Tuesday, September 5th. Grade 1-7 students attend from 10-11am. Students will meet in grade group classrooms to meet our staff, take attendance and to welcome everyone back. Parents and caregivers are invited for refreshments at the front of the school. Grade meeting locations are posted on the outside school doors. Kindergarten students should have received a letter outlining the gradual entry schedule for your child's first few days. If you did not receive this, please call the office for this information or check the information posted at the school and on our website. New students who are not yet registered, are asked to report to the office.

Our PAC invites parents/care givers to enjoy some refreshments at the front of the school during this hour.

First Week Plans

Our staff has carefully planned activities for our first few days back to school. Students will be involved in a variety of activities in their grade groups as well as some activities with other primary and intermediate grades. Students will meet in their assigned grade group rooms each morning (as below) and will be dismissed from this same room at the end of each day. Our main goal of the week is to make all of our students feel a part of our Royal Heights community through a variety of collaborative team building and learning activities. This schedule also provides our staff with some flexibility while student numbers and classes are confirmed. We plan to have students placed into permanent classes by Monday, Septemeber 11, 2017 but this will depend on our final enrolment. We will keep you posted.



Student Safety

In the interest of safety, everyone entering the school must check in at the office. We have a visitor protocol that involves signing in and wearing a badge. Classrooms are busy learning places and we try not to interrupt them during instructional time. If you need to see your child, leave him or her a message, or drop off a lunch, our office staff will happily take care of that for you.

Forms

This week, all students will be bringing home a package for your update and completion. It is imperative that the school has updated information. If your child has any medical concerns that require special care, we ask that you please come to the office for appropriate forms as soon as possible.

Optional Student Accident Insurance

Did you know that the Surrey School District does not insure expenses for student injuries that happen on school grounds or during school activities? You are responsible for these expenses as a parent or guardian.

Your DPAC and the School District provides the opportunity to voluntarily purchase private accident insurance through the Kids Plus™ Accident Insurance program underwritten by Industrial Alliance Insurance and Financial Services Ltd.

Plan features:

- Provides coverage **365 days a year**, 24 hours a day, in or out of school.
- Covers expenses that are limited or **not** insured under MSP, private or group insurance plans; for example, private tutors, lump sum payment for fractures and dislocations, counselling and much more.
- Covers injury related **Dental** (including future expenses).
- 2 Covers injury related **Eyeglasses** (repair or replace).
- **Low** annual premiums from \$14.50 per student for the Basic Plan

School Fees



Student Planner: We encourage all students in Grades 1 – 7 to purchase a School Planner at a cost of \$2.00. "As part of the provincial student learning grant, the student planner has been reduced from \$5 to \$2 for the 2017-2018 school year. The remaining funds from this learning grant have been used to provide learning resources to schools." Included in the planner is our school code of conduct, school calendar and school district information. We find this to be an excellent tool for facilitating home/school communication, as well as for developing our students' organizational skills. However; using our school planner is optional as a parent may purchase their own version.

Field Studies and Field Trips: Classes often enjoy educational visits to community facilities that extend and enhance the curriculum. While we use school, PAC monies or fundraise to cover the cost of such activities wherever possible, there are times when parents are asked to contribute toward the cost of the trip. If you choose to have your child not participate in a field study, a suitable program will be provided at the school.

Musical Instruments: Grade 4 students may learn to play the recorder. Students will have the option of purchasing one through our music teacher for \$5 or providing their own. Also, our band students either rent or purchase an instrument, music books and reeds for Band. Costs vary depending on the instrument.
