Principal's Message

Hello to our Parents and Students! I hope you are all well and safe! Again, welcome back and please remember that when our students returned to Kwantlen Park, our shared responsibility is to help end the COVID 19 pandemic. Therefore, we must plan to ensure the safety of our students and staff as we return to school.

Lunch:

Now that we are into late September, and the annual rains are starting to hit us, we are going to allow students to stay inside at lunch. Our hope is still for students to go home for lunch if it is possible; if not, we will take care of them. Again as a reminder, we are asking that all of our students eat lunch in their Block A classroom. After their lunch, the students can travel throughout the school inside and out.

School Open Morning Time: If possible, please do not drive your kids to school earlier!

As you know, school starts at 8:25 each morning for our grade 8/9 students and for our grade 10-12 school starts at 8:55. With the weather turning worse, we are now allowing students to come into the building at 8:10 each morning for our grade 8/9s and 8:35 for our Grade 10-12s.

Parent Consent Required for On-line Classes:

The school district is in the process of turning on Two-Way Text Private Chat and Two-Way Video Conferencing for our on-line courses. The district is asking that all parents fill out one of the following fillable PDF consent forms. Your child's learning at home would benefit from opportunities for two-way video conferencing with school staff. Two-way video conferencing may also include small group or whole class participation.

With your consent, the times and manner of the video conferences will be set by the school staff in consultation with you, and these sessions will be communicated through the method decided by the school staff. Our top priority is to ensure that the best supports are in place while protecting the privacy of families and students. An email with working links was sent to parents on September 24th.

We are asking that families send these forms back to school with your children to the office side window by Friday, October 9th.

Beginning Tuesday, October 13th, IMS will begin the procedure of turning off Two-Way Video Communication for students who have not returned their consent forms.

PE Classes in our Local Community:

Our PE classes are planning on spending more class time outside, therefore, please be advised that students will be going for walks and runs through our community. They will be under the direct supervision of their teachers at all times.

Student Fees:

\$20 Student Fee: this year, because of the unique situation we are in, the \$20 Student fee will be waived for the time being.

Grad Fee: this year we will be postponing the collection of this year's Grad fee until later in the school, most likely February.

On-line Grade 8 & 9 Schedule:

Our grade 8 and 9 Kwantlen on-line courses began on Monday September 21. Teachers are currently reaching out to their on-line students using Microsoft Teams (our teaching platform), email or telephone. Again, direct teaching will occur on Teams so it is important that all students be enrolled in the appropriate Team. We are quite limited in what we can offer on-line to our grade 8 and 9 students, but rest assured that they will have an opportunity to complete their six core courses this year.

Parents, if you want your child to return to face-to-face learning for the next quarter, please contact your child's vice-principal or counsellor to discuss options.

*Check BCCDC's Symptoms of COVID-19 regularly to ensure the list is up to date.

If you answered "YES" to any of the questions and the symptoms are not related to a preexisting condition (e.g. allergies) your child should <u>NOT</u> come to school.

If they are experiencing any symptoms of illness, contact a health-care provider for further assessment. This includes 8-1-1, or a primary care provider like a physician or a nurse practitioner.

If you answered "YES" to questions 2 or 3, use the <u>COVID-19 Self-Assessment Tool</u> to determine if you should be tested for COVID-19.

General Safety Protocols for all students:

To help ensure staff and student safety, students should only show up at their scheduled time and follow these safety guidelines:

Prior to coming to school, students must ensure they are healthy and feeling well.

- Do not come to school if COVID symptoms are present. For example: new or worsening cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, temperature equal to or over 38°C, feeling feverish, chills, fatigue or weakness, muscle or body aches, new loss of smell or taste, headache.
- Students have been provided with two reusable face masks. Students must wear masks while in common areas, like hallways.
- Upon arrival at school, students must ENTER through one of two entrance areas: The main entry doors, and the Den doors. All other doors will be locked.
- Upon entry, students must use the hand sanitizer provided and proceed directly to their classrooms. As a precaution, students should wear masks as they could be entering the building with students outside of their cohort.
- Please come to school as close to the start time as possible as we do not want overcrowding outside the entry points. When exiting the building please do not loiter. You are to leave directly from school property.
- Non-medical masks are required in high traffic areas such as buses and in common areas such as hallways, or anytime outside of their learning group whenever physical distancing cannot be maintained.
- Exceptions will be made for students who cannot wear a mask for medical reasons.
- Please follow the directional arrows in the building.
- Students must enter the classroom one at a time, in a socially distanced and patient manner.
- When in the classroom, students are to remain in the desk assigned to them.
- If students need to use the washroom, the teacher will ensure that only one person goes to the washroom at a time. When you exit and enter the classroom you need to hand sanitize. If the washroom is occupied, please wait outside in the hallway in a socially distanced space.
- **Washrooms:** some student washrooms will be closed, except for a number of universal bathrooms and few specific washrooms throughout the school; please use those if you need. This will help us sanitize bathrooms quickly.
- Students must engage in proper 20-second hand washing prior to leaving the washroom.
- At lunch, it is best to go outside and stay within your cohort whenever possible. If in contact with peers in different cohorts you will need to maintain physical distance of 2 meters and/or wear a mask.
- If a student is unable to physically distance, the student should only socialize within their cohort unless they are supported by an adult who can help the student physically distance from others.
- **Hand hygiene:** During the day, students must wash their hands regularly and use the hand sanitizer provided.
- **Physical distancing:** Students must avoid close greetings (ex: hugs, handshakes). When in the hallways, students must always be mindful of **maintaining a 2-meter distance from others** and/or wear a mask.
- At the end of the school day, students are to safely exit the school as soon as possible.
- **Water Bottles:** all students may bring water bottles to class if they wish; all water fountains except bottle dispensers are turned off.




