### *Student Schedules*

Planning for the 2026–2027 school year is well underway. Our administration and counselling teams continue to finalize student timetables, considering final semester marks, summer learning updates, and course availability. Student schedules will be accessible through MyEducation BC in August once the new school year officially opens.

For planning purposes, students should be prepared for the following daily schedules:

Grades 8 & 9: 8:00 AM – 2:23 PM

Grades 10–12: 8:00 AM – 3:50 PM

Students in Grades 10 through 12 will continue to have Flex blocks built into their schedules. More detailed information about expectations for Flex time will be shared during grade-level assemblies at the start of the school year.

Next year, courses will run on a fixed A–B–C–D–E block structure. This schedule does not rotate; instead, students will follow the same order each day, aligned with the bell schedule shared in late May.

There will be limited opportunities for course changes in late August and early September. These requests will be considered only under specific circumstances, such as graduation requirements, and are subject to space and staffing limitations given our high enrolment.
