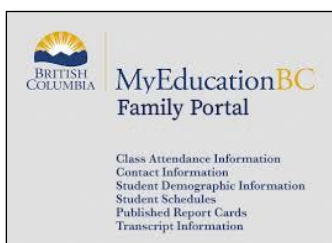

Enver Creek Secondary provides student schedules and report cards through the MyEducationBC (MyEdBC) Family Portal for Parents and Guardians.

Information on accessing the Family Portal can be found on the school website <https://www.surreyschools.ca/envercreek> under the "Resources" tab. If you already have a Family Portal Account, it will remain the same. If you are new to MyEducationBC and you have provided the school with a valid email address, that full email address will become your Login ID. New users will receive an email from *sysadmin@MyEducationBC.ca* with a temporary password early in September to initialize their access to the Family Portal.

IMPORTANT: *Please ensure that you set up your account and make ALL password changes on a wired desktop computer and NOT on a wireless device (i.e, smartphones, iPads, laptops may NOT work). Please be sure to set up your security preferences as this will allow you to reset your own password when the office is very busy.*

The Family Portal will allow you to access your child(ren)'s course schedule, report cards, attendance information and much more.

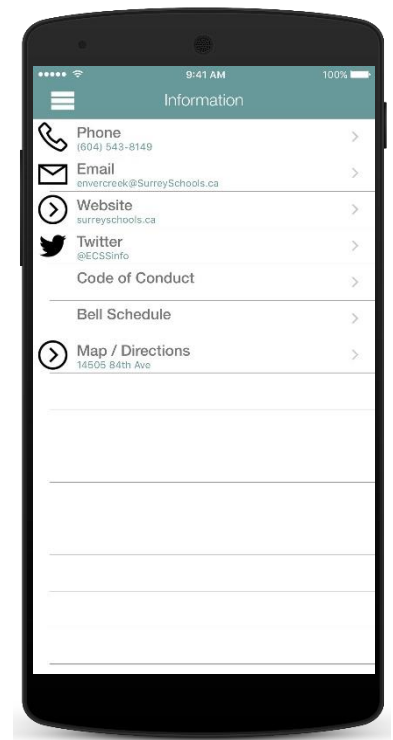

ENVER CREEK SECONDARY GENERAL SCHOOL FEES 2024 - 2025

Instruction is provided free of charge to all students registered in a school's education program sufficient to meet the general requirements of graduation, and it shall provide free of charge any resource materials necessary to participate in that program. The School Act permits the charging of fees for certain items. In Surrey Secondary Schools, the following structure applies through Board Policy 9802 related to fees and any costs for students or families. Students will need to provide their own basic supplies and equipment for their own personal use such as paper, writing tools, calculators, notebooks, gym attire, sewing kits, music instruments, and some other items needed for various electives. Workbooks may be provided to students on loan, or they may be purchased for personal use. Students can also elect to purchase other support materials (professional resources including practice examinations) through their teachers. Some courses such as Textiles and Woodwork provide students with the option of using different or better-quality materials, which may be brought from home or purchased from the school at a cost. Some courses, such as AP (Advanced Placement), offer optional certifications or external examinations for which there are charges. If you wish to discuss the implications that these charges may have on your child, please contact our school administration.

*Multi-Sport Athletes: Athletes that have paid for a sport that costs more than \$80 in the school year, can have \$40 waived off an additional sport that costs more than \$80. The athlete needs to present a receipt from school cash online to the Athletic Director.

*If an athlete does not return their uniform at the end of the season, the athlete will be charged a replacement uniform charge as determined by the Athletic Director.

*Athletic fees need to be paid in the year that they play, or they will not be able to play the next year until the fee is paid.

AP (Advanced Placement) Examination Fee (per exam)

The cost will be between \$140.00 and \$150.00 with precise cost being determined closer to payment deadline taking exchange rate into consideration.

Cafeteria Food Safe Certification \$25.00

Fine Arts, Home Economics, Performing Arts, Technology Education

Students can elect to enhance their personal projects through special purchase of materials.

Workbooks for personal use are recommended but not compulsory in several courses (Mathematics, Sciences, Languages, Business Ed., etc.). Fees represent cost recovery only and average between \$5.00 and \$30.00 per workbook.

REPLACEMENT CHARGES

Students will be assessed a charge for lost or damaged school property (textbooks, Library books, uniforms, music instruments, etc.) Charges will be based on the replacement cost of the item. Students are expected to return the same textbook they are issued so it is important to label your text with your full name and student number and avoid lending textbooks to other students.

MATERIALS CONSUMED IN A COURSE

In courses that consume materials (e.g. art, cooking, woodworking, metalwork, science, band) schools can only charge for materials or goods that are surplus to what would be necessary for the student to meet the expected outcomes in a course. If a student is going beyond the basic requirements of a course and creating projects for personal use (e.g. creating a table from mahogany rather than plywood), then the student may bring their own materials from home or the cost for the materials for these enhanced projects may be recovered through a fee.

FIELD TRIPS

Students may be charged a cost for expenses such as transportation, accommodation, meals, entrance fees and equipment rentals for optional field trips, or other extracurricular outings or events. Students will not be charged fees for any field studies/field trips where attendance is mandatory as part of a course or program.

MEDIA COVERAGE / WEBSITE CONSENT / WEB 2.0 TOOLS

"*Media / website consent form*" and the "*Web 2.0 Tools consent form*" will be distributed by TAG teachers and will be required for all grade 8 and new students to Enver Creek Secondary School. These forms are to be completed once at the secondary school level and will be valid until graduation, unless a new form is submitted to change consent. Continuing students will receive forms when information verification is requested in October, if no form is currently on file. All Enver Creek students will have a school email address and internet access for their educational use.

ATTENDANCE

Regular school attendance is a major factor contributing to student success in school. Our students are expected to be at school on time and to attend classes punctually and regularly. Students make a commitment to take selected courses and are expected to attend all classes in which they are registered. Students struggling with chronic tardiness and truancy will work with their teachers, counsellors, administration, and guardians to come up with a collaborative solution. Often students who are driven to school are late to their first class because of congestion created when many vehicles arrive at the same time. Parents who drop off students can help by planning to arrive well before classes begin and/or dropping off their students away from the main entrance.

If your child will be absent from school, or will be arriving late or leaving early, we ask that a parent call our office at (604) 543-8149, before 9:00am if possible. Parents/guardians may leave a voicemail on our Absentee Line if unable to call during regular office hours. Students who need to leave before the end of the school day MUST sign out at the School Office, preferably with a signed note from a parent/guardian. If no note is provided, office staff will make a confirming phone call before students are dismissed. For student safety reasons, we do ask that parents call the school office to make necessary arrangements should they have an emergent need to take their child(ren) out of class during the day.

EXTENDED ABSENCES

Each school year we are approached by parents who wish to take their child(ren) out of school for extended periods of time. Enver Creek Secondary does not sanction the absence of any student during the school year for any reason other than illness or bereavement. However, we understand that time with families is important and travel distances sometimes mean that school absences are unavoidable. Please be aware that any planned absence greater than five (5) school days requires the student to complete an Extended Absence Form and the parents must arrange to speak with an Administrator prior to departure to ensure a clear understanding of the academic impact and to have an academic plan in place.

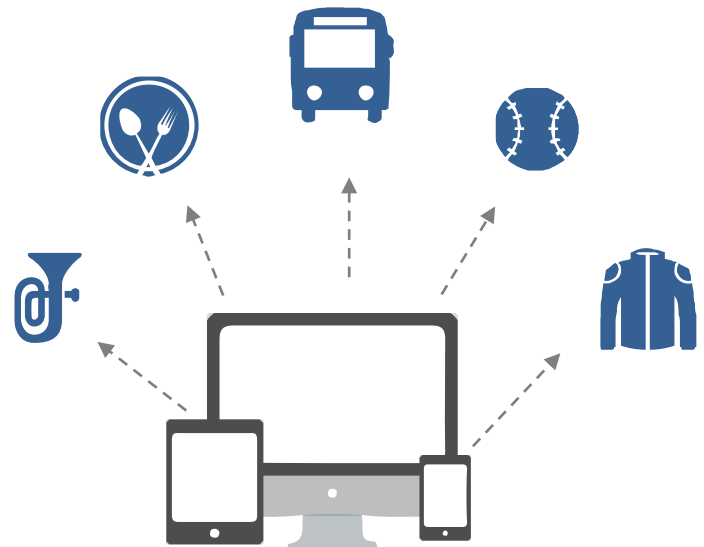

Credit Card

STUDENT AGENDA

The Enver Creek Student Agenda contains information vital to success at Enver Creek and is also a useful tool for planning and organizing course work, homework and other activities. Students in Grades 8 will receive a printed agenda as well as access to an electronic version via our school app, EnverCreek. Students in grades 9, 10, 11 and 12 will receive the electronic version only, but can request a printed version if desired.

Parents and students are encouraged to review the *Student Code of Conduct* and our *Policies and Procedures*, found in the Agenda and our Student Handbook located on our school website under "Our School >> Code of Conduct". **We strongly advise students to leave valuable personal possessions at home (i.e., cell phones, Air Pods etc.). The school does not accept responsibility for any lost or stolen property.**

PERSONAL DIGITAL DEVICES (Surrey School District Policy)



In response to the Provincial government's direction to school districts, Surrey now has a new policy for personal devices and cell phones. Please take a moment to read it below. There is ample research on the negative effects of smartphone addiction. At EC, we want to provide a learning environment that is safe and positive, and one that encourages students to build healthy relationships with others. To this end, cell phones are to be put on silent and away, during class time, unless the teacher directs otherwise. Please call the school if you need to contact your child.

Personal Digital Devices are defined as any personal electronic device that can be used to communicate or to access the internet, such as a cell phone, tablet, laptop, or smartwatch. These devices are important tools which can be used to enhance learning and prepare children for the world in which they will work and live. Personal digital devices provide support for children who rely on these tools to access learning through services such as translation, adaptations for Individual Education Plans, medical support, health needs, or to provide equity of access to resources. The classroom teacher is responsible for the learning environment in the classroom, for guiding children to use personal digital devices appropriately, and for determining when personal digital devices should be used.

The safe and responsible use of personal digital devices is expected by all Surrey School District students, employees, volunteers, parents, guardians, and community members who are on school district property or interacting with students or staff. This includes the following:

- Those using personal digital devices need to abide by the school code of conduct as well as all Provincial and Federal laws and the British Columbia Human Rights Code. This includes not using personal digital devices to engage or participate in bullying or harassment, discrimination, or defamation of character.
- At both elementary and secondary schools, personal digital devices can be used during class time to enhance learning at the direction of the classroom teacher. These devices should be used in a way that is respectful of other's learning and does not distract others in terms of light, sound, or by other means.
- At elementary schools, it is expected that personal digital devices are to be put away during non-class time such as recess and lunch. Exceptions to this are for students who need digital devices for medical or health reasons, translation, accessibility, or other student-specific reasons.
- Personal Digital Devices should not be used during lock down procedures or drills. The use of personal digital devices during this time may impact the emergency safety response.
- Surrey School District staff and students should not be recorded, visually or audibly, for any reason without their prior consent.
- **The Surrey School District is not responsible for lost, missing, or damaged personal digital devices that students choose to bring to school.**

SCHOOL SUPPLIES

As each student will have a different schedule and different teachers, we do not provide a list of required school supplies. If you wish to purchase some items prior to the start of school, the following are general supplies used for most classes: 3-ring binders (approximately 1 1/2"), supply of loose-leaf paper, index dividers, pens, pencils, erasers. Please do not purchase a calculator until your child has spoken with their Mathematics teachers. Teachers may have specific requirements for each class and will advise students of those items during the first week of school.

LOCKERS

Enver Creek locker sign up is through an On-Line Locker Management System.

Lockers are optional and will be available for selection on specific dates depending on the grade of the students.

Online student accounts have been created for all current students.

To log in:

1. Go to locker administration web site for the school – <https://ec.lockerassignment.com/>
2. Login using your student number as the user id and your birth date as the password, in “YYYYMMDD” format. After entering your STUDENT #, you must enter your password. Your **password is your birthday**. The format of the password is YYYYMMDD, so if you were born Sept 19, 2004, your password would be 20040919
3. Select a zone of the school in which you would like to have a locker. When a zone is selected the available lockers will be listed. A locker entry that is **Green** is an empty locker, and a locker entry that is **Orange** has a person in the locker already.
4. Once you have selected a locker you will be shown the locker combination. You can login at any time to see your assigned locker and combination.
5. **You cannot change your locker once it is selected.**

LOCKER AREAS:

There are 2 floors at Enver Creek. If you go to the On-Line Locker Website above, you can check out the locker areas and start to pre-plan where you may like to have a locker. **Most top lockers are even numbered, and most bottom lockers are odd numbered.**

LOCKERS – CONDITIONS OF USE

RULES REGARDING STUDENT LOCKERS: CONDITIONS OF USE

Lockers are assigned to students for use during the school year under the following conditions:

1. Students are responsible for the locker which is assigned to them, and it is not to be used by any other person.
2. Only approved locks may be used on student lockers and the combination of the lock must be registered at the office.
3. The locker may only be used for the storage of books, school supplies and equipment, outerwear, school sports equipment and lunches.
4. No other material is permitted except with the written authority of the principal or vice principal.
5. The locker is to be kept clean and food removed on a regular basis.
6. Students are responsible for cleaning and removing all material from their locker at the end of the year or when they leave the school.
7. No illegal substances, weapons or other prohibited or offensive material may be placed in school lockers.
8. School officials and/or designates may search student lockers at any time and without prior notice in order to ensure compliance with the conditions of use and other school policies and rules. Searches by school officials may include the use of dog units to detect the presence of narcotics or other prohibited materials.
9. Permission to use the locker may be terminated when a student does not comply with the conditions of use or school policies or rules.
10. It is the responsibility of all members of the school community to keep our schools safe. If any student has reason to believe that any locker contains anything which would threaten the safety of other students, staff or any other person, that student is expected to immediately report the information to a teacher or administrator. The name of the student making such a report will be kept confidential.

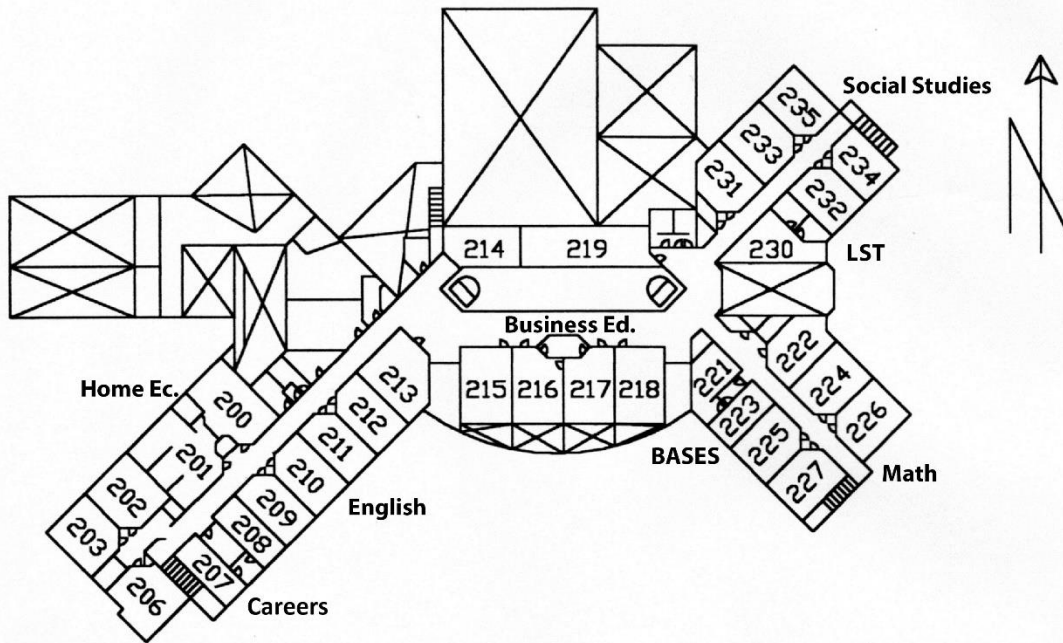

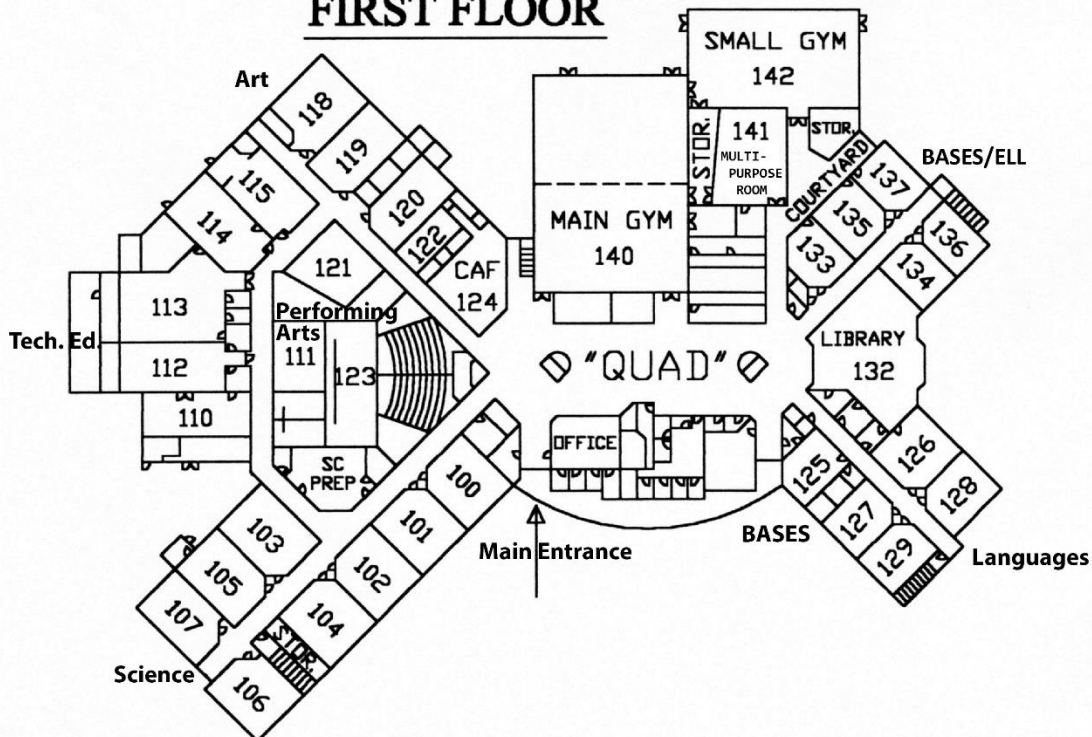
