What is French Immersion

Major goal of French Immersion programs:

the opportunity for non-Francophone students to become bilingual in English and French





- A communicative approach to language acquisition
- Additive bilingual program
- Fosters an appreciation and an acceptance of cultural diversity
- Compatible to brain research: language learning is innate for children
- Expected to take several years to achieve its objectives

Program Expectations

Students become functionally fluent in French and English

Students graduate with a bilingual Dogwood diploma upon completion



Ministry Graduation Expectations

- Grade 11 or 12 Ministry French literacy assessment
- DELF (optional) International accreditation of French language competency

participate easily in conversations in English and French

take post-secondary courses with French as the language of instruction

accept employment with French as the language of the workplace.

French Immersion Facts

Started in Canada in 1965; in Surrey: 1977

Well-researched: Canada is famous for its research on Immersion

Over 450,000 students enrolled in immersion programs across Canada

Approximately 3400 students currently in Surrey

What about English language skills? Research says...

- French Immersion students excel in their English language courses and Ministry evaluations
- Transfers from a child's first language support their learning of additional languages and in turn a first language may be enhanced by the acquisition of a new language
- Children are learning French after they have mastered the vocabulary and syntax of another language

What about English Language Learners? Research says...

Most children who begin Immersion in Kindergarten already speak at least one language very well

ELL support begins in Grade 3 when English Language Arts is introduced What about achievement in other subject areas? Research says... French Immersion students' performance in other subjects equals that of other students at their grade level in the regular English program



What about children with special needs?


Research says...

- French Immersion is a program for all learners!
- Students with learning disabilities have the same access to curriculum and learning as they would in the regular English program
- those with learning challenges as well as gifted learners can be successful
- Learner Support Team services are available in all Early Immersion schools
- Neurodiverse children (e.g. ASD, ADHD) have been shown to gain benefits from French Immersion exposure matters!

How does it work? Early Immersion

- Students learn French and other subjects using French
- Wide range of vocabulary, language learning situations and interaction with the language
- Students experience two literacy programs: English and French
- TIME in the language = fluency and confidence

How can l help at home? 95% of French Immersion parents do not speak French. It is important therefore to:

- Establish good rapport with your child's teacher
- Read to your child in your home language(s)
- Support a positive learning environment at home
- Ask your child what they are enjoying about their French learning
- Encourage your child to sign out French library books, watch TV in French, and listen to French music



How can l help at school?

- Talk with the teacher about helping. Non-French speakers are welcome!
- Participate in field trips, reading, doing hands-on activities, helping in the library, joining the PAC
- Make an effort to use basic French greetings and questions as much as your ability allows



Kindergarten Lottery Registration Process 2025

January 13, 2025	Register at local catchment school
January 27, 2024 @ 9:00 am	Kindergarten Lottery application opens online
February 14, 2025 @ 4:00 pm	Kindergarten Lottery applications close online

Parents apply for the lottery by entering their details, their child's details (*one application per child*), and their preferred program/school choices (*up to a maximum of three - listed in order of preference*).

Lottery information Early French Immersion

Once the online application period has closed, a random lottery draw will take place. Applicants will be contacted starting February 21, 2025, indicating whether or not the lottery was successful for their child/children. Successful applicants will be allocated a place in a Kindergarten Lottery Programs school, and their registration package will be forwarded to the school. All other applicants will be placed on a waitlist.

Program seats are filled until all available places have been allocated. Waitlisted applicants may remain on the waitlist until a place becomes available. If a student drops out of a program before or during the program, the next applicant on the waitlist will be contacted.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

French Immersion is a research-based program that provides students with the opportunity to learn French from an early age. Starting in Kindergarten, or Grade 1 if space is available, Early French Immersion provides instruction entirely in French until Grade 3, after which 20% of instruction is in English and 80% in French up to Grade 7. This program aims to develop strong communication skills in both languages, as well as an understanding of language structure that may help students learn other languages more easily.

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French is one of Canada's two official languages, and its worldwide distribution makes it a valuable language to learn in today's global society. With more than 45 countries sharing the language, French is considered a "world" language. The acquisition of French can prove to be a valuable asset in the future, as it can lead to increased opportunities in both personal and professional settings.
