THE BC SCHOOL SYSTEM

EDUCATIONAL QUALITY

British Columbia's public K-12 education system is among the most respected in the world for its high standards, exceptional student achievement, and commitment to investing in quality education.

TEACHERS

All public school teachers are trained professionals. Teachers must have both a bachelor's degree and a specialized teaching degree or diploma where they demonstrate through lesson planning and several practicums that they are a capable teacher.

DIVERSITY

Public schools honour diversity, acknowledging and utilizing differences in a positive and beneficial way.

CURRICULUM

All public and private schools teach the same curriculum developed by the Province of British Columbia and provide the same high-quality education for your child.

FUNDING

Public schools in Canada are not free; they are funded by taxes, residency, and in some cases, immigration status. Eligibility is determined by the BC Ministry of Education. This is why most international students pay tuition fees to attend public school.

ACADEMIC RANKING

Academic school ranking systems are *not* supported or funded by the public education system (government) or your school.

CURRICULUM IN BC

THE 'KNOW-DO-UNDERSTAND' MODEL


Teachers in British Columbia are guided by the BC Curriculum, which is created by the BC Ministry of Education. The curriculum is multi-dimensional and organized into a 'Know-Do-Understand' model (right).

Content Learning is what students are expected to **KNOW**. This is divided into specific subject areas for each grade level.

Curricular Competencies are the skills, strategies and processes that students develop over time to demonstrate their learning and knowledge — like mental math strategies or other things that students **DO** to show their learning.

Big Ideas are the overall generalizations that students need to **UNDERSTAND** and which help focus a unit of study.





THE CORE COMPETENCIES

As well, teachers focus on core competencies, which are at the heart of each lesson in your child's classroom. These are the social, cultural, creative and critical capabilities that your child needs to demonstrate as an active learner:

Communication — Students are expected to communicate in various ways beyond writing, including expressing oneself orally, presenting information and working with others effectively.

Creative and Critical Thinking — Students work to generate their own ideas, and problem solve through 'play', exploring, observing others, inquiry, conducting research and gathering information, then applying it to new situations.

Personal and Social Identity and Responsibility — Students should be able to express themselves and their ideas, and recognize and manage their emotions appropriately. Students should be able to make safe choices and show respect for others.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

All students study:

- English literacy (reading, writing, spelling, speaking)
- Mathematics
- Science (Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Earth Science, environment)
- Social Studies (History, Geography, cultures, social responsibility)
- Fine Arts (Art, Music, Dance)
- Physical Education (sports, movement, health)
- French (in grades 5–7)

Throughout these subjects, Surrey Schools teachers help students learn about caring for people and their communities, global citizenship and use of the most modern and innovative technologies available.



INTERNATIONAL ELEMENTARY PROGRAM

Enrolment

Students can enrol for either September or January.

Application

No application fee and space permitting, you can choose your school.

Grade placement

Grade placement is determined by a student's year of birth and the last grade completed.

English language support

Students are given an assessment to determine the level of English language support needed.



Uniforms

Students are not required to wear uniforms, though they are required to dress appropriately for school.

Lunch

Students are expected to bring a snack and lunch from home. On certain days, hot lunches may be ordered in advance (for a fee).

Homework

Students are expected to do approximately 30-40 minutes of homework and/or reading each day depending on their grade level.

SCHOOL SCHEDULE

Timetable

Hours of study are Monday to Friday 8:30 am – 2:30 pm (approximately).

Breaks

The school day has two breaks: 10:15 am for a 15 minute recess and 12:00 pm for a 45 minute lunch.

Vacations

The school year offers two vacation breaks: two weeks in the winter (late December/early January) and two weeks at Spring Break (mid-late March).

Holidays

There are no classes on statutory holidays (Easter, Thanksgiving, etc.) and on teachers' professional development days.






CLOVERDALE



WHITE ROCK & SOUTH SURREY

MCW - MULTI-CULTURAL WORKERS

Surrey Schools has Multi-Cultural Workers available to help children, parents and custodians in their first language. They can attend school meetings, help support and assess students and provide translation.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

ENGLISH LANGUAGE SUPPORT

When international students first arrive, they are assessed to determine the level of English support required. While international students are fully integrated into regular classes, they may also be assisted by learning support specialists in or outside of the classroom as needed. In elementary school, there is no separate ESL class. The focus is on learning English through immersion.





ORIENTATION

Upon arrival, parents and custodians are invited to an Elementary Orientation session. We review school schedules and policies, provide information about the BC education system and answer lots of questions! It is also a great chance to meet our Multi-Cultural Workers (MCW) who translate the session into several other languages.

PARENT PROGRAM

Surrey Schools offers a free English language program for international student parents. Twice a week, parents attend a special morning class taught by a Surrey teacher. The program is focused on helping parents develop their English language skills, learn about life in Canada, make friends and get involved in their community.









GET INVOLVED IN YOUR SCHOOL

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Most schools provide information through an email newsletter or blog and have a parent committee that is optional to join.



FINE ARTS

Students can join school music programs, learn to play an instrument, sing in a choir or perform in concerts and school plays.

SPORTS

Each school offers after-school sports teams for intermediate students (usually grades 4–7). Sports played in elementary schools include volleyball, basketball, soccer and track and field. All schools have a gymnasium, outdoor sports fields, athletic equipment and playgrounds.



FIELD TRIPS

To encourage learning outside the classroom, schools provide field trips throughout the year, including visits to museums, science and technology centres, and local theatre performances. Students also enjoy field trips for ice skating, swimming and other athletics.

MORE TO DO IN SURREY

SURREY RECREATION

The City of Surrey Recreation Guide comes out four times a year. Wellness, Fitness, Aquatics, Skating, Arts, Languages, and day camps are just some of the programs offered for children, teens and adults.

NATURE TRAILS

There are more than 100 kilometres of nature trails within Surrey parks. You will find urban forests with lakes in busy city centres, world-class bird-watching opportunities, salmon hatcheries and giant trees over 60 metres tall!


FESTIVALS AND EVENTS
