General Strategies for success on any kind of test

PREPARE



Do NOT just:

- ✓ read from the textbook
- make long pages of notes



This is generally not an effective way to study.

PREPARE



Use flashcards



- mind maps
- time lines
- word webs

- Eat a healthy breakfast


Come Prepared

- Set a comfortable pace
 - Divide the time remaining by the number of problems
 - ✓ Ignore the other students in the room
- Answer easy questions first
 - ✓ Build your confidence

Answer ALL Parts

✓ Read the question carefully and make sure that you answer EVERYTHING that it asks for. Some short answer questions have multiple parts.

For Example...

What makes Mr. Jellema the best principal in Surrey? Why is Enver Creek the best school in Surrey? Provide examples for each.



"When can I stop making wild guesses and start making educated guesses?"



- Be aware of how many marks each question is worth.
 - ✓ If a question is worth 3 marks, you need to include 3 separate pieces of information.

For Example...

Describe the main points of the Kinetic Molecular Theory. (4 marks)

Return to Challenges

If you don't know the answer, come back to it after you finish the rest of the test and make an educated guess. Other parts of the test may give you clues to the answer.



Types of Questions



- True / False
- Matching
- Multiple Choice
- Written Response

True / False Questions



- Every part of a true sentence must be "true"
- If any part of the sentence is false, the whole sentence is false despite many other true statements.

 E.g. Mr. Macgregor is extremely intelligent, a sharp dresser, and a great hockey player.

3 Strategies



Strategy #1

Eliminate the easy ones first!



If an answer can only be used once, cross it out after it has been used.



Strategy #2

Determine whether the definition describes a person, place, or thing.

Only match:

- people with people
- places with places
- ✓ things with things



Strategy #3

- Use your knowledge of the English language to find clues within the definitions.
 - Look for familiar prefixes and suffixes within larger terms
 - E.g. <u>hydro</u>electric power

Strategy #1

Eliminate an obviously wrong choice

What is the capital of B.C.?

- a) Seattle
- b) Vancouver
- c) Victoria
- d) Kelowna



Strategy #2

- Watch out for absolute words
 - ✓ no, never, none, no one
 - ✓ all, always, every, entirely
 - ✓ only, ever

✓ These words mean the statement must be true 100% of the time. Think carefully before you choose this type of answer.



Strategy #3 Trick for "All" Questions

- If you're sure that at least two of the choices are right, then the answer must be "All."
- Which of the following are types of math?
 - a) adding
 - b) subtracting
 - c) logarhythms
 - d) all of the above



Strategy #3 (continued)

- If you know that at least one of the choices is incorrect, then the answer can't be "All."
- Which of the following are types of math?
 - a) art
 - b) neurology
 - c) trigonometry
 - d) all of the above

Written Response Questions

4 Strategies



Strategy #1

Read the instructions very carefully.



Strategy #2

Write a strong thesis statement.

- State your main point (argument) clearly.
 - ✓ If you don't have a clear idea of what you're trying to say, your essay will be weak and difficult to understand.



Strategy #3

Prove your thesis

Back up your argument by providing examples and reasons that clearly explain why your thesis is right.



Strategy #4

Proofread

Proofread your essay before handing it in to make sure you have said all the important points for your topic.
