- 2. Remove your iPad from the old server
- 3. Enroll into the new server
- 4. Then notify the IMS Service Desk to push out the new AESA App.

CADD Access Program for Indigenous Peoples (CAPIP) course (students 18+)

Kwantlen Polytechnic University's (KPU) last session of the CADD Access Program for Indigenous Peoples (CAPIP) course will be offered Jan. 7-Mar. 19, 2019 at the Fraser Region Aboriginal Friendship Centre Association's (FRAFCA) Education

Centre in Surrey. CAPIP is designed to support personalized learning for adult Indigenous students (18+) who want to upgrade their math and English, gain essential computer skills, explore design and drafting, and potentially discover a rewarding career in Computer Aided Design & Drafting (CADD). This final session of the program will run Monday and Tuesday evenings from 5-9 pm, Jan. 7-Mar. 19, and is **tuition-free for Indigenous learners**. Students are able to learn at their own pace and the Eagles of Tomorrow Education Society (EOTES) is also offering a \$50 scholarship/gift card for each EOTES math workbook students complete (up to 5 workbooks).
