## **Cross Cultural Connections: Youth Symposium on Anti**racism 2020

Please select 3 student representatives from your school to attend the  $4^{th}$  annual Cross-Cultural Symposium on Anti-Racism to be held on March 4, 2020 at REC in Room 304, breakfast snacks and lunch included. The 3 students should be from culturally diverse backgrounds in grades 10-12 including one Aboriginal student and one who is an artist, to spend the day listening and discussing the presentations by speakers who have confronted racism and discrimination.

A smaller group of students (20-30) will be recruited to work with Roxanne Charles, Semiahmoo artist to create art pieces with anti-racism themes.

The proposal is for the art to be collected in an anthology and will include responses from teachers.

The anthology will serve as qualitative data as we engage in the equity scan process.
