Indigenous Students Interested in Creating Film

Creative OUTlets are free two-day stop-motion filmmaking workshops for artists aged 13–18 interested in making projects focused on 2SLGBTQIA+ identities, issues, and themes. The workshops are open to youth across BC and will take place on Zoom.

The first workshop is specifically for Indigenous youth anywhere in BC and will run October 28–29, with an optional session on November 1. Youth will receive a \$50 Gift card for participation

The second workshop, open to all youth across BC, will run November 4–5, with an optional session on November 8.

All sessions will take place 12–3 pm on Zoom. Participants need a smartphone with a working camera, but all other supplies will be provided by mail.

Those who complete and submit their projects will receive a Creative OUTlets gift bag, and will enter a draw to win professional filmmaking supplies and equipment. Prizes including a new Google Pixel 4a smartphone, a Manfrotto fluid head tripod, JBL headphones, and more! All projects will also be eligible for screening at the Vancouver Queer Film Festival in August 2022.

FREE Coaching Course: Standard First Aid Hosted by ISPARC and Aboriginal Youth FIRST

The Standard First Aid Course is a comprehensive two-day course offering first aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) skills for those who need training due to work requirements or who want more knowledge to respond to emergencies at home. This course meets legislation requirements for provincial/territorial worker safety and insurance boards and includes the latest first aid and CPR guidelines. See <u>flyer</u>.

Registration is open to anyone of Indigenous descent! We may also accept people who work in the sports, health, or wellness industry, or directly with the Indigenous community. **Participants must be over twelve years of age to take the course.** Anyone under eighteen is encouraged to register with a family member, guardian, or friend. You must attend both dates (Saturday November 13th and Sunday November 14th)

Lunch is provided, but please bring a water-bottle. Wear clothing for easy movement.
