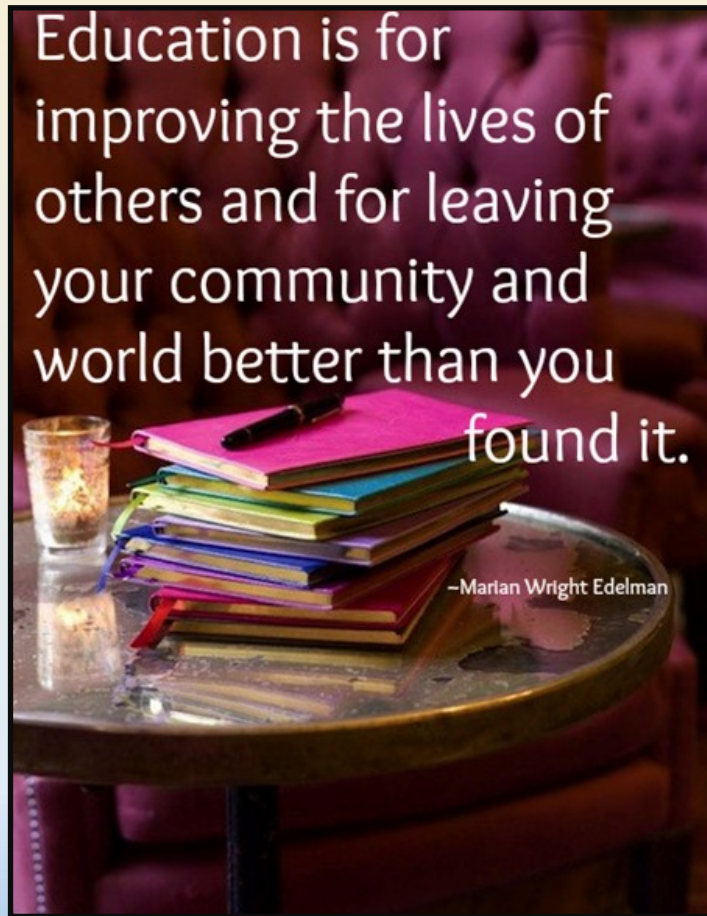



## **“This Week at Fleetwood Park” – Principal’s Message: April 13<sup>th</sup> – 17<sup>th</sup>**

Good morning Dragons,

Another week of this challenging COVID-19 pandemic reality has now elapsed; and our entire Fleetwood Park family continues to adjust and respond. Our first priority is to do all we can to help fight COVID-19 and to support the Health Care System. In moving forward, as we have begun to provide learning activities ‘at a distance’, the health and safety of our students/ parents and staff are foremost in our minds. It again goes without saying, that all Fleetwood Park Dragons, students/parents and staff, deserve so much credit for your perseverance and hard work over the past 3 weeks in adjusting to online learning. Thank you everyone for all you have accomplished in order to provide and participate in “continuity of learning”. We continue to look forward to the day that we are able to welcome all Fleetwood Park Dragons “back to school”!





Over the past week, our teachers have continued to reach out to students and expand their online learning activities. All students should have now been in touch with all of their teachers. Our goal is to progress slowly and steadily as we develop expertise and create online content. We are aware that this is not “business as usual” and that there are significant challenges to text-based online learning. We are hopeful that a slow, measured approach will not overwhelm students and parents. The social-emotional health of our community is a top priority. Students, please reach out to your teachers and/or school if you require support and assistance to help you stay engaged with your learning.

Last week I mentioned that the Ministry of Education released an [FAQ document](#) that provided information regarding marks, assessment and graduation. Here are a few of the important details:

## **SECTION 4 | MARKS, ASSESSMENTS AND GRADUATION**

### **Will all students receive a final grade for each course they are enrolled in?**

- Yes, all students will receive a final grade for each course they are enrolled in and successfully complete from now until the end of the school year.
- Teachers will determine a final grade for students based on work completed to date and the assessment of learning that will occur over the coming months.

Teachers will consider those students whose learning needs or circumstances may require unique approaches to assessment.

### **What will happen with graduation and student assessments this year?**

- As in any given school year, students on track or eligible to graduate will be able to graduate provided the student has completed sufficient learning in their coursework. This includes what they have learned since the course started, along with the learning they will complete from now until the end of the school year.
- To be “eligible to graduate” means a student will satisfy all graduation requirements upon successful completion of courses they currently have underway and are continuing through to June 2020. This does not mean that students will graduate no matter what.
- Sufficient learning will be determined by teachers using their professional judgement. Grounded in the curriculum, teachers will assess what individual students know, understand, and are able to demonstrate to determine whether enough learning has taken place to enable the student to pursue further learning in the curricular and content area.
- Students are expected to continue their learning for each course they are enrolled in and to complete assignments set out by their teachers to finish their courses.
- Teachers will work with students to develop plans and set reasonable expectations given the current circumstances and the individual needs of the students.
- This will be guided by the plans and priorities set out by districts and schools for continuity of learning at the local level, recognizing that many students may not have easy access to specific learning resources.

The previously scheduled April 2020 graduation assessment administration has been cancelled. The Ministry is assessing a range of options to ensure this graduation requirement can be met by those students who are otherwise on track to graduate this year.



To summarize, students will receive a final mark that will include all of their work over the weeks ahead. Students are expected to continue their learning and to complete assignments set out by their teachers to finish their courses. Teachers will carefully consider assessment requirements due to these very unique circumstances. Students/parents are encouraged to contact your counsellor or teacher or administrator if you have any questions about these expectations for learning as described by the Ministry of Education. We will continue to share any District and/or Ministry updates as we receive them.

This week we sent out an application form to all students/families regarding pick-up of “essential learning items” from lockers. If you missed this, please see our website. Again, our goal is to minimize the material required from the school by providing as much as possible online. We are now in the process of creating a “pick-up” schedule that will allow for a safe and properly distanced visit to the school. Students are reminded to please check your email for your opportunity to schedule a pre-determined visit time slot.

Dependent upon need, we will continue to explore further options to provide students additional learning resources from the school as necessary.







On behalf of the entire Fleetwood Park staff, I wish all Dragons a safe and productive Friday and weekend. I hope your learning is progressing and that you are finding ways to stay connected to your family and your community while maintaining your health and well-being. Please know that we miss you and send you our best wishes. The school building is only an empty shell without our students and staff and community at-large. The true spirit of Fleetwood Park, our Dragon Pride, resides in each and every one of you, and will remain strong throughout this time of separation.
