Rationale:

- -students have access to each class once a week
- -students attend one class each day, keeping them out of hallways moving from class to class

- -staggered start/end times will help reduce congestion in the hallways

Good morning Fleetwood Park,

On behalf of the entire staff at Fleetwood Park Secondary, I wish all Dragons good health and learning success as we entire the final phase of our school year. Over the past week we have offered our hybrid instructional model with small numbers of students receiving in-class tutorial support, and all students continuing to learn from a distance. Thank you to all students and staff for your flexibility in adhering to our regulated inschool learning environment. We appreciate the additional challenges that "stage 3" has meant for all students/staff. We also recognize the value that our model of continuity has provided our students over the past months.



As we move into the final week of in-class sessions, our students will continue to have the option of attending school by pre-registering with their teachers. Students are reminded that you can find each teacher's sign-up schedule in your course's learning platform. Please contact your teacher through email if you have any questions about how to "sign up" for a session. Students are also reminded that your online instruction will continue until the final day of "classes" on June 19th. Semester Completion days will occur from June 22 – 25th and will also require students to schedule appointments with their teachers.

Our health and safety protocols will continue to be in place for the remainder of the school year. This will include strict regulation of building and classroom density, pre-registration of all students in the building, physical distancing, restriction of visitors to the school, hand washing before and after each session, increased cleaning protocols and daily self-assessments of health for all students and staff. We would like to thank everyone for taking these protocols seriously and protecting the health of our community.


Home of Dragon Pride "Building Successful Futures"
