The recognition and celebration of our graduating class of 2020 is such an important tradition. We are very excited to share our plans to celebrate the Commencement of our Grad 2020 students. Fleetwood Park Secondary will be hosting a Commencement ceremony that will recognize our graduates, allow parents/guardians to watch their children “walk the stage” and will follow all the Provincial Health Orders. We will ensure that our Grads and their guests will feel comfortable and safe during our ceremony. And we will honour our students and their families with pride and joy!

We know that high school graduation is a once in a lifetime event, and that it is so very important for parents/guardians to see their children walk across the stage and receive their graduation certificate. With this, we have planned a three-day long event, that will allow every grade 12 student to attend with two guests.

On **June 10-12<sup>th</sup>** we will be hosting a series of Commencement ceremonies in our gymnasium from 2pm to 8pm each day. Fifteen Grads will attend with two guests in each 45 minute session. ## In The News

Please see this important [video message](#) for parents, students and staff as we begin to chart a path to slowly re-introduce face-to-face instruction in our schools as the province lifts COVID-19 restrictions.

The model that the province is announcing includes:

- A part-time return to face-to-face instruction for children in Grades K-5;
- Part-time face-to-face instruction for students in Grades 6-12; and
- The continuation of remote and online learning.

"The guidelines we are hearing suggest that balance will be the equivalent of alternating days for students in K-5 and one day a week for students in Grades 6-12," says Surrey Schools Supt. Jordan Tinney. "School districts are busy now trying to design models that meet the goalposts of these guidelines. The provincial guidelines include the principle that parents will have the choice to have their children remain learning at home or to have some access for face-to-face balanced with their current online/remote learning. No matter what, our hybrid models include face-to-face and online or remote learning for all children."

## **“This Week at Fleetwood Park” – Principal’s Message: May 10<sup>th</sup> - 14<sup>th</sup>**

Good morning Dragons,

Welcome to “This Week at Fleetwood Park” as we complete another week of “learning at a distance”. We are now moving into week 7 of our remote learning model and the progress that British Columbia has made in fighting COVID-19 is encouraging. Last week, the Provincial Government released its 5-stage plan for a gradual return to school. As we await further details, school districts across the province are thinking about what this could look like in schools and the structures and safety protocols that would be required. There are still many questions, and I am reassured that the health and safety of our students and staff continues to be our top priority.

We will continue to provide information as it becomes available; and we will continue to support our students “at a distance”.





Over the past weeks, our students and staff have learned so much. Class routines are now established, learning platforms operational, with communication tools and expectations in place. Although these learning structures are becoming more routine, we continue to understand and appreciate the challenges that remote learning brings to our Dragon community. I want to stress to all students and staff that the work you are doing to support “continuity of learning” is transformational and unprecedented. Your efforts are highly valued, and are directly benefitting our students and our society at-large. Thank you for all you are doing. I also want to again stress, that our focus continues to be on the social-emotional well-being of our students and families through the delivery of a narrower curriculum of literacy and numeracy objectives. “Continuity of Learning” is not simply the repackaging an entire curriculum and uploading it to a learning platform. We have been very deliberate in our learning outcomes and the volume of work assigned and we will continue to strive to find an appropriate balance for our community.





With respect to “balance”, the expectations for student engagement, marks and assessment continues to be an important conversation. In previous weeks, I have shared the Ministry of Education’s expectations for both students and teachers as we have navigated through our new reality. Here are a few more quotations from the [“Frequently Asked Questions on Continuity of Learning” Ministry document](#) that demonstrate the balance we are attempting to achieve.

### Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) on Continuity of Learning K-12 EDUCATION SYSTEM

- ⇒ All students – including students who are on track to graduate – are expected to complete course work assigned by teachers.
- ⇒ To be “eligible to graduate” means a student will satisfy all graduation requirements upon successful completion of courses they currently have underway and are continuing through to June 2020. This does not mean that students will graduate no matter what.
- ⇒ Students are expected to continue their learning for each course they are enrolled in and to complete assignments set out by their teachers to finish their courses. These assignments must be reasonable for each student in their home learning environment, recognizing that many students may not have easy access to specific learning resources.
- ⇒ Teachers will work with students to develop plans and set reasonable expectations given the current circumstances and the individual needs of the students.

With this, we will do all that we can to engage our students in their learning, we will consider the unique learning environment that we are all working within, and we will plan for the individual needs of our students. In order to accomplish these goals, communication between teachers and students has never been more important. Thank you to all students and staff for reaching out and staying connected. I believe this is the single most important factor in supporting a successful online learning experience.



In last week's message, I spoke about the need for a "different" graduation ceremony for our 2020 graduates. We have received much feedback from students, parents, other Surrey Secondary schools, the District and the Province. Please see the initial details of our plans in this week's newsletter and thank you to everyone for your input. We recognize the importance of our students' and staff's accomplishments and the value of these graduation traditions. I would like to reassure our community that we will provide a meaningful and special opportunity for our graduating students and parents, and I strongly encourage all of our graduating students to participate in this year's Commencement ceremony. You can begin by responding to our surveys regarding Grad gowns and comments.
