- 1. Under "CANADA" click on: Fleetwood Park Secondary, Surrey BC
- 2. Register for an account by clicking the "CLICK HERE TO REGISTER" menu tab (under the LOGIN) and filling in the on-line form. Choose a user id and password for yourself and then click the "Register Now" button.
- 3. Add your children into the system by clicking the "Add a Student" button. Click "Insert New" button to add more children.
- 4. Click the "date" icon beside each child's name to schedule appointments. Select the staff you wish to book appoint ments with and the "View Calendars" button. Use the "Ctrl" or "Command" key to select multiple staff to view the same time.
- 5. Click on available time slots to book your appointments and then click the "**Book Appointments**" button to save your bookings.



Health and Safety

This week Fleetwood Park Secondary issued another Notification of Exposure letter to our staff and community. This was another reminder to us that Covid-19 is within our community and that we are in the middle of the 2nd wave of the pandemic. Our school reflects our community – and it is essential that everyone follows the necessary Health and Safety guidelines to help flatten the curve and keep us safe. 1. STAY HOME WHEN SICK

4. PHYSICAL DISTANCING AND MINIMIZING PHYSICAL CONTACT

2. HAND HYGIENE

Thorough hand washing with plain soap and water for at least 20 seconds is the most effective way to reduce the spread of illness.



CLEANING AND DISINFECTION

Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces at least twice a day.

General cleaning of the centre should occur at least once a day.

Use common cleaning and disinfectant products.



3. RESPIRATORY AND PERSONAL HYGIENE

Cover your coughs.

Do not touch your face.

No sharing of food, drinks, or personal items.








^{*}Check BCCDC's Symptoms of COVID-19 regularly to ensure the list is up to date.

If you answered "YES" to one of the questions included under 'Key Symptoms of Illness' (excluding fever), you should stay home for 24 hours from when the symptom started. If the symptom improves, you may return to school when you feel well enough. If the symptom persists or worsens, seek a health assessment.

If you answered "YES" to two or more of the questions included under 'Symptoms of Illness' or you have a fever, seek a health assessment. A health assessment includes calling 8-1-1, or a primary care provider like a physician or nurse practitioner. If a health assessment is required, you should not return to school until COVID-19 has been excluded and your symptoms have improved.

When a COVID-19 test is recommended by the health assessment:

- If the COVID-19 test is positive, you should stay home until you are told by public health to end selfisolation. In most cases this is 10 days after the onset of symptoms. Public health will contact everyone with a positive test.
- If the COVID-19 test is negative, you can return to school once symptoms have improved and you feel
 well enough. Symptoms of common respiratory illnesses can persist for a week or more. Re-testing is not
 needed unless you develop a new illness.
- If a COVID-19 test is recommended but is not done because you choose not to have the test, or you do
 not seek a health assessment when recommended, and your symptoms are not related to a previously
 diagnosed health condition, you should stay home from school until 10 days after the onset of symptoms,
 and then you may return if you are feeling well enough.

If a COVID-19 test is not recommended by the health assessment, you can return to school when symptoms improve and you feel well enough. Testing may not be recommended if the assessment determines that the symptoms are due to another cause (i.e. not COVID-19).

If you answered "YES" to questions 2 or 3, use the <u>COVID-19 Self-Assessment Tool</u> to determine if you should seek testing for COVID-19.

A health-care provider note (i.e. a doctor's note) should not be required to confirm the health status of any individual.
