

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CAREER EDUCATION 8 AND CAREER EDUCATION 9

In addition to your grade 8 and/or 9 child's current timetable at Fleetwood Park Secondary your child is enrolled in a Career Education 8/9 course. These are required courses and connect to senior Grade 10 Career Life Education (CLE) and Grade 11/12 Career Life Connection (CLC) courses which are mandatory for graduation. The teacher connected to this program and delivering these courses is Mr. Craig Erb.

Students in grade 8/9 will focus on the three large Curricular Competencies:

- · Personal Development
- Connections to Community
- Life and Career Plan

GRADE 8

In grade 8, students will be set up with their own MyBlueprint account the first 2-3 weeks of Quarter #2. MyBlueprint is a digital learning platform designed for students and used throughout High School and throughout Grade 10 Career Life Education and Grade 11/12 Career Life Connections. Using MyBlueprint, students will be given opportunities to reflect on the following Core Competencies:

- Communication
- Critical Thinking
- Social / Emotional Learning

Immediately following the creation of their MyBlueprint account, Grade 8 students will start to transfer their completed MyBlueprint assignments into their portfolio for grading. The first assignment posted in MyBlueprint will be a short reflection on the Grade 8 Retreat/Welcome. Another assignment Grade 8 student will eventually need to transfer into their portfolio is the assignment they received from their Arts/ADST/Tech Ed/Music instructor.

Students will not receive a grade until the end of the year. Their grade will be based on the contents of their portfolio. Students must check their emails and their MyBlueprint account on a regular basis to ensure no assignments are missed.

GRADE 9

In the past Grade 9 students have gone to work with their parents/guardians as part of "Take Your Kids to Work Day". Due to COVID, this year students will remain at school and partake in an activity designed to explore career options and identify possible career pathways. This activity will take place on Monday, November 2nd.

Students in Career Education 9 will not have a regular class to attend but rather meet 2-3 times a year and engage in learning through the online MyBlueprint platform. This will be a continuation from their grade 8 portfolios which they begun last year on the program. Students will be instructed once again on how to log into and use MyBlueprint in class when the group first meets Nov. 2.

All assignments, evaluations, and reflections will be uploaded and collected in a portfolio through MyBlueprint. These will be given a formal mark and students will receive a letter grade for the course. If there are any missed assignments, they will be notified through MyBlueprint and therefore should be checking it often.

No sharing of food, drinks, or personal items.




"This Week at Fleetwood Park" - Principal's Message: October 26th - 30th









Both structures have required significant change, pedagogical review and the ongoing demands of resilience, flexibility and innovation. We appreciate the excellent shared strategies that staff have explored and we know that these systems will continue to evolve and grow over time. We also touched upon another very important conversation for our community: school culture. As we have shifted to such a new way of being, with many of our traditional opportunities for community-building curtailed, it is essential for all of us to be very intentional about how we sustain and build a strong, positive and healthy school culture for both students and staff. With this, we have initiated a school culture working group that is focussed on planning events/structures/special activities that will celebrate Fleetwood Park Secondary. We will continue to look for ways of honouring our traditions in a covid-aware and safe manner, and develop new celebrations and rituals that bring us together as a community.

Our Parent Advisory Council met on Monday evening for a very important budget planning meeting. Great thanks to all members of our PAC who joined us to discuss the allocation of this year's Gaming Funds for extracurricular activities across our school. We know that the additional resources/activities made possible through your support will have a direct and positive influence on our school community, culture and well-being. Thank you!

Continuing on the theme of well-being and culture, our School District hosted a "Student Voice" live virtual meeting and survey this week. As the regular District Student Leadership structures are not in place this year due to the pandemic, the District is wanting to hear student voices and gather opinions.
