

Our school year began on September 8th with staff and then on September 10th with students. All systems and routines of the school have been rebuilt in order to address the COVID-19 guidelines for health and safety. The first days for all Dragons involved Health and Safety training/presentations and orientation. Homeroom teachers reviewed our new Timetable, bell schedule, quarter system, hygiene and cleaning requirements and much more. Despite this very different school environment and "new normal" we were delighted to again experience the positive energy of our students as they returned to school after many months away.

This year, with assemblies not possible, we created a video presentation for grades 9-12, and Administration has provided individual presentations to Grade 8 classes. Today we enjoyed the opportunity to meet with the grade 8 students and introduce our school to them. Our themes of flexibility, resilience and creativity were on display and will be required throughout the year as we re-envision the many events/activities that will occur.

Regular classes began on Monday, September 14th. Students are organized into cohorts. Grade 8-9 cohorts will remain together throughout the year. Grade 10-12 students will be taking a blended learning program, with their block A cohort meeting at the school, and their block B class meeting online and in small tutorial groups. Students will be working on a Quarter system, taking 2 courses at a time for 10 weeks. The timetable was developed to minimize the number of contacts students have at the school. I have been impressed with the patience and support demonstrated by our entire Dragon community. Thank you to everyone for your ability to adjust to a new way of learning.

As students are now organized into cohorts, timetable changes for Q1 classes will not be possible. Our counsellors will continue to work on student's timetables that are missing a course for graduation, and the changes will be reflected in cohorts/classes later in the year. Timetable changes at the best of times is extremely difficult and the mandate of cohort organization makes this even more of a challenge.

I would like to recognize and thank our amazing summer custodial crew who worked very hard to prepare our beautiful school/grounds for the new school year. The school is in excellent condition and we are ready to go!


