Dear families,

Yesterday, there was a tragic school shooting in Tumbler Ridge, BC and the RCMP have confirmed multiple fatalities, including the individual believed to be responsible. As more information becomes available, our hearts are with the victims and their families, as well as the parents, students, staff of the school community and the entire Tumbler Ridge community facing this unimaginable loss.

For those of us who have the privilege of working in education, the safety and well-being of every student is our highest priority every day. It is both shocking and heartbreaking when a place meant to be safe, supportive, and nurturing becomes the site of a tragic event. Please know that principals, vice-principals, school counselors, district resource counselors, Safe Schools are ready to support our schools and families throughout the district.

The district has shared information with staff about how to guide conversations and address concerns brought to them by our students. As a caregiver, you can monitor their media exposure, spend time with them, listen and seek additional support. We are here to help. There are additional resources listed at the end of this letter for families.

As the Tumbler Ridge community navigates the difficult days and weeks ahead, our thoughts and support remain with them. In times like these, we are reminded of the importance of caring for each other and coming together in compassion, and solidarity.

Thank you for your care, compassion, and support of our students and school communities during this time.
