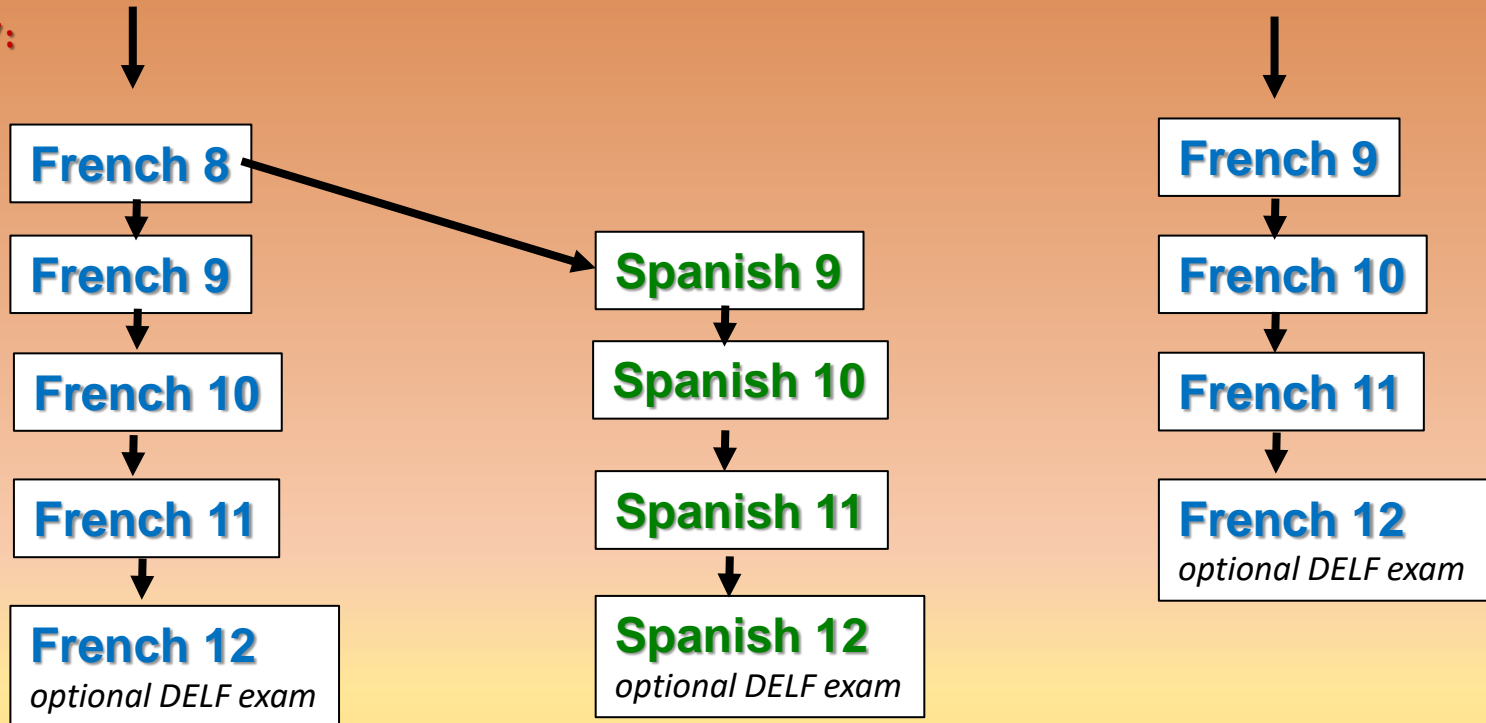
LANGUAGES progression

New Course: Introductory Punjabi 11

- ▶ Limited to no background in Punjabi required
- ▶ Intensive course designed to prepare for Punjabi 11
- ▶ Learn alphabets, grammar, vocabulary, reading, writing, listening, and speaking
- ▶ Explore Punjabi culture
- ▶ Satisfies SFU Language 11 entrance requirement.
- ▶ Does not satisfy Language 11 entrance requirement for UBC Vancouver Campus (need Punjabi 11)

Jazz Band 10

- ▶ Theatre Company is more than a course. It is an immersive collaborative experience. Students will be given a safe place to practice taking creative risks.
