I'm reaching out to you today as we currently have an influx of volunteers for our Study Buddy program in the Surrey area. This is a FREE service for youth and families to provide tutoring to self-identifying girls between the ages 7-17 who are struggling academically.

We know the past year and a half has been difficult for youth academically, but we can support them. Our Study Buddy volunteers are also fantastic role models and support systems for their youth outside of the academic work. The sessions can be done in-person or virtual depending on the families comfort level.
