No Gathering on the School Grounds

The weather is nicer and more of our parents have been gathering on the school grounds before and after school to chat with friends and neighbours. At this time, district protocols have not changed and we ask you to remember that adults should not be gathering or coming onto the school grounds during the day. If you are coming with a preschool aged child, we ask that you wait off the school grounds rather than using our playground where students may be gathered.

Drop-off Lane (Kiss and Go)

Please remember the Drop Off Lane in front of the school, by our kindergarten rooms is exactly that, a drop off zone. We ask that families driving to school use this lane to drop off children and then move forward and out of this zone. Please do not stop to chat with your children or to wait and watch as they head to class. If you need to do so, please park in a space near the road or walk with your children. When parents continue to park or wait in this zone, near the no stopping signs, it impedes traffic and creates a safety concern for students who must walk through this area.

Fees for Next Year

Each school year, parents support their child(ren)'s formal learning experiences in a wide variety of ways. We appreciate all that you do to ensure a successful year!

We have provided an itemized school supply list based on grade. Parents may opt to purchase supplies directly from the company. However, parents may choose to wait to do the purchasing themselves.

In addition to providing the school supplies itemized on a grade list, parents are periodically asked for monies to cover specific items and/or special events. No student will be denied the opportunity to participate in any school activity due to the inability to pay. Please contact the Principal should you require any financial assistance.

As we plan for the upcoming school year, we anticipate the following costs:

Student Planner:

We encourage all students in Grades 1-7 to purchase a School Planner at a cost of \$5.00. Included in the planner is our school code of conduct, school calendar and school district information. We find this to be an excellent tool for facilitating home/school communication, as well as for developing our students' organizational skills. However, using our school planner is optional as a parent may purchase their own version.

Field Studies and Field Trips:

Classes often enjoy educational visits to community facilities which extend and enhance the curriculum. While we use school monies or fundraise to cover the costs of such activities wherever possible, there are times when parents are asked to contribute towards the cost of the trip. If you choose to have your child not participate in a field study, a suitable program will be provided at the school.

Musical Instruments:

Grade 4 students may learn to play the recorder. Students will have the option of purchasing one through our music teacher for \$10 or receiving one on loan from the school. Also, our Grade 7 students who take band may either purchase or rent an instrument. Costs vary depending on the instrument.

School Supplies:

Parents have the option of purchasing their child's school supplies on their own utilizing the grade supply list or for your convenience you may wish to purchase supplies as a package through School Start. Payment is made directly to School Start. Costs for supplies vary based on grade but will not will not exceed \$60.00.

Kindergarten: This school year, as in past years, the teachers will be collecting \$45 per student to cover the cost of school supplies for the kindergarten classes. This enables them to buy supplies in bulk at a discounted price, as needed and reduces the need for storage space throughout the year.

Grade 7 Camp—Students go to a year end camp for outdoor education and leadership. The cost is approximately \$350.00. Some fundraising will be done to offset these costs.

School Supply Fees for 2021-2022 may change due to circumstances in schools as a result of Covid-19.
